

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


- State law requires that each county have a Mental Health Board or Commission.

- Board members advise the Board of Supervisors and the Behavioral Health Director on various aspects of local mental health programs.


MHB Mission

- 50% of the MHB membership shall be persons with mental illness or family members of those who are receiving or need mental health services. At least 20% of the membership shall be persons with mental illness and at least 20% shall be family members.
- Vacancies are filled based on the supervisorial district of where you live.



1st READING & INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE 2016-02 ADDING WMC CHAPTER 8.34, "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" AND AMENDING WMC CHAPTER 5.04 "BUSINESS LICENSE TAX" BY AMENDING WMC SECTION 5.04.020 "LICENSE-REQUIRED" AND AMENDING TITLE 17 "ZONING" BY ADDING WMC SECTION 17.40.320 "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION"

SUMMARY:

Several legislative bills were approved this summer affecting medical marijuana and some will require updated ordinances by the city in order to retain local licensing control. In response to these legislative bills, City staff is proposing to amend the City's Municipal Code to add a new section Chapter 8.34 – Medical Marijuana and Cultivation, and amend Chapter 5.04.020, and amend Chapter 17 – Zoning Code by adding Chapter 17.40.320. The proposed additions and amendments to the Waterford Municipal Code is attached hereto for City Council review as Ordinance #2016-02.

City staff recommends approval of the Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance 2016-02.

FISCAL IMPACT:

N/A

ANALYSIS:

The legislative bills mentioned above have been reviewed with the City Council.

AB 266 (Bonta, Cooley, Jones-Sawyer, Lackey, Wood): establishes dual licensing structure requiring state license and a local license. A local agency may prohibit marijuana delivery and cultivation with an update to the local ordinance, if in place by March 1, 2016.

AB 243 (Wood): establishes a regulatory and licensing structure for cultivation sites.

<u>SB 643 (McGuire):</u> establishes criteria for licensing medical marijuana businesses, regulates physicians, and recognizes local authority to levy taxes and fees.

Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 2016-02 provides local authority and direction in regards to medicinal marijuana and cultivation and defines how this use is contemplated in the City's Municipal Code. Notably, AB 266 requires that local agencies may elect to prohibit marijuana and cultivation through its Municipal Code. If this is not completed by March 1, 2016, the State becomes the sole licensing authority for medicinal marijuana and cultivation. Thus, the intent of Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 2016-02 is to preserve local authority on prohibiting medicinal marijuana, cultivation and transportation, including a prohibition on recreational marijuana should it be legalized in the State.

The added language to the Health and Safety Code, WMC Chapter 8.34 provides definitions consistent with the Compassionate Use Act and preserves local authority. Chapter 8.34 prohibits medical marijuana, cultivation, transportation and dispensaries in the city's jurisdiction. This chapter also establishes civil penalties.

The Waterford Municipal Code is also amended at Title 5, Chapter 5.04 to prohibiting the issuance of business licenses for distribution, cultivation, transportation, delivery, or processing of medical marijuana (cannabis).

The Planning Commission conducted a duly noticed public hearing at their regular meeting held on December 22, 2015 and approved 4-1 a recommendation of adoption to the City Council by adoption of Planning Commission Resolution 2015-04, attached hereto. In addition, the Planning Commission made a determination that Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 2016-02 was exempt from further environmental review in accordance with Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines by adoption of PC Resolution 2015-04.

CEQA:

This ordinance is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15305, minor alterations in land use limitations in areas with an average slope of less than 20% that do not result in any changes in land use or density and section15061(b)(3) which is the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment and CEQA does not apply where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. The City's permissive zoning provisions already prohibit all uses that are being expressly prohibited by this ordinance. Therefore, this ordinance has no impact on the physical environment as it will not result in any changes.

PROCESS:

Ordinance 2016-02 is before the City Council for a public hearing to consider approving the Introduction and First Reading by titles only. Thereafter, a summary of the Ordinance will be published in the *Waterford News*. The Ordinance is scheduled to come back to the City Council as a public hearing item at the January 21, 2016 council meeting to consider the second reading by titles only and adoption of Ordinance 2016-02.

Thereafter, within 15 days of passage and adoption the Ordinance Summary will be published in the *Waterford News* together with the names of the members of the City Council voting for and against same. This ordinance will become effective and be in full force on and after thirty (30) days of its passage and adoption.

WATERFORD PLANNING COMMISSION RESOLUTION # 2015-04

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WATERFORD PLANNING COMMISSION IN REGARDS TO ADDING WATERFORD MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER ("WMC") 8.34, ENTITLED "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" AND BY AMENDING WMC CHAPTER 5.04, ENTITLED "BUSINESS LICENSE TAX" BY AMENDING WMC SECTION 5.04.020, ENTITLED "LICENSE REQUIRED" AND AMENDING TITLE 17, "ZONING" BY ADDING WMC SECTION 17.40.320, ENTITLED "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waterford is amending Title 8, "HEALTH AND SAFETY" by adding WMC Chapter 8.34, "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" to prohibit medical marijuana activities and amending Waterford Municipal Code Chapter 5, "BUSINESS LICENSE TAX," by adding language to prohibit the issuance of a business license for medical marijuana (cannabis) collective, cooperative or dispensary and shall not approve licenses or uses for the distribution, cultivation, transportation, delivery, or processing of medical marijuana (cannabis) and by amending Title 17, "ZONING", by adding WMC Section 17.40.320, entitled "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" completely prohibit commercial and non-commercial activities of all types expressly in all zones, planned developments, master plan areas, and all zoning districts in the City of Waterford.

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 65855 requires that the City Council receive input and a recommendation from the Planning Commission on a Zoning Amendment that imposes any regulations listed in Section 65850;

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has reviewed the proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment and conducted a public hearing December 22, 2015 at which time it considered all evidence presented, both written and oral and at the end of the hearing voted to adopt a resolution recommending that the City Council not adopt/adopt this Ordinance;

WHEREAS, all other legal prerequisites to the adoption of this resolution have occurred.

WHEREAS, the City of Waterford has in place an ordinance prohibiting certain uses which are believed to be illegal under federal or state law;

WHEREAS, Health & Safety Code Section 11362.83 provides that cities are free to adopt and enforce local ordinances that regulate the location, operation, or establishment of medical marijuana dispensaries and cultivation;

WHEREAS, the Waterford Planning Commission desires to submit Ordinance 2016-02 to the City, pursuant to this Resolution to include WMC 8.34 medical marijuana/cultivation, amend WMC 5.04 entitled business license tax, amending WMC 5.04.020 entitled license required, and amending Title 17, Zoning by adding WMC 17.40.320 entitled medical marijuana/cultivation.

WHEREAS, on October 9, 2015 Governor Brown signed three bills into law, specifically AB 266, AB 243, and SB 643 which are collectively known as the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act (hereinafter "MMRSA") which requires both state and local licensing/permits. The MMRSA set up a State licensing scheme for medical marijuana uses while protecting local control by requiring that all such businesses must have a local license or permit to operate in addition to a State license. The MMRSA allows the City to completely prohibit medical marijuana activities.

WHEREAS, in City of Riverside v. Inland Empire Patients Health and Wellness Center, Inc. (2013) 56 Cal.4th 729, the California Supreme Court held that "nothing in the Compassionate Use Act ("CUA") or the Medical Marijuana Program ("MMP") expressly or impliedly limits the inherent authority of a local jurisdiction, by its own ordinances, to regulate the use of its land..." Additionally, in <u>Maral v. City of Live Oak (2013) 221 Cal.App. 4th 975</u>, the Court of Appeal held that "there is no right – and certainly no constitutional right – to cultivate medical marijuana..." The Court in <u>Maral</u> affirmed the ability of a local government entity to prohibit the cultivation of marijuana under its land use authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Planning Commission of the City of Waterford hereby recommends to the City Council approval of the proposed Ordinance 2016-02, as attached hereto as Exhibit A to this Resolution based on the following findings:

- 1. <u>Pursuant to California Government Code Section 65854</u> the recommendation to City Council shall include the relationship to the applicable general or specific plan
 - a. Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 2016-02 is compatible with the General Plan and each of its element and all components
 - b. Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 2016-02 is compatible with the uses authorized in, and the regulations prescribed for, the land use districts for which it is proposed and with the regulations for each land use district.
- 2. Constitutionality, severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word of this resolution is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the resolution. Ordinance 2016-01 adding WMC Chapter 8.34, entitled "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" and Amending WMC Chapter 5.04, entitled "BUSINESS LICENSE TAX" by Amending WMC Section 5.04.020, entitled "LICENSE-REQUIRED" and Amending Title 17, entitled "ZONING" by Adding WMC Section 17.40.320, entitled "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION".

The proposed ordinance adds and amends various Chapters of the Waterford Municipal Code to prohibit medical marijuana cultivation for commercial or non-commercial purposes, transportation, delivery or processing of medical marijuana (cannabis) and expressly prohibited in all zones, planned developments, and all zoning districts, as well as specific and master plan areas in the City of Waterford. No person including, but not limited to a qualified patient or primary caregiver, shall cultivate any amount of cannabis (marijuana) in the city, even for medical purposes.

ORDINANCE 2016-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE WATERFORD CITY COUNCIL ADDING WATERFORD MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 8.34, ENTITLED "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" AND BY AMENDING WMC CHAPTER 5.04, ENTITLED "BUSINESS LICENSE TAX" BY AMENDING WMC SECTION 5.04.020, ENTITLED "LICENSE-REQUIRED" AND AMENDING TITLE 17, "ZONING" BY ADDING WMC SECTION 17.40.320, ENTITLED "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waterford is amending Title 8, "HEALTH AND SAFETY" by adding WMC Chapter 8.34, "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" to completely prohibit commercial medical marijuana activities and amending Waterford Municipal Code Chapter 5, "BUSINESS LICENSE TAX", by adding language to prohibit the issuance of a business license for medical marijuana (cannabis) collective, cooperative or dispensary and shall not approve licenses or uses for the distribution, cultivation, transportation, delivery, or processing of medical marijuana (cannabis) and by amending Title 17, "ZONING", by adding WMC Section 17.40.320, entitled "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" to completely prohibit commercial and non-commercial cannabis activities of all types expressly in all zones, planned developments, master plan areas, and all zoning districts in the City of Waterford.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WATERFORD, COUNTY OF STANISLAUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE:

- A. 1n 1996, the voters of the State of California approved Proposition 215 (codified as California Health and Safety Code § 11362.5 and entitled "The Compassionate Use Act of 1996" or "CUA").
- B. The intent of Proposition 215 was to enable persons who are in need of marijuana for medical purposes to use it without fear of criminal prosecution under limited, specified circumstances. The proposition further provides that "nothing in this section shall be construed to supersede legislation prohibiting persons from engaging in conduct that endangers others, or to condone the diversion of marijuana for non-medical purposes." The ballot arguments supporting Proposition 215 expressly acknowledged that "Proposition 215 does not allow unlimited quantities of marijuana to be grown anywhere."
- C. In 2004, the Legislature enacted Senate Bill 420 (codified as California Health & Safety Code § 11362.7 et seq. and referred to as the "Medical Marijuana Program" or "MMP") to clarify the scope of Proposition 215 and to provide qualifying patients and primary caregivers who collectively or cooperatively cultivate marijuana for medical purposes with a limited defense to certain specified State criminal statutes. Assembly Bill 2650 (2010) and Assembly Bill 1300 (2011) amended the Medical Marijuana Program to expressly recognize the authority of counties and cities to "[a]dopt local ordinances that regulate the location, operation, or establishment of a medical marijuana cooperative or collective" and to civilly and criminally enforce such ordinances.
- D. In <u>City of Riverside v. Inland Empire Patients Health and Wellness Center, Inc.</u> (2013) 56 Cal.4th 729, the California Supreme Court held that "[n]othing in the CUA or the MMP expressly or impliedly limits the inherent authority of a local jurisdiction, by its own ordinances, to regulate the use of its land. . . . " Additionally, in <u>Maral v. City of Live Oak</u> (2013) 221 Cal.App.4th 975, the Court of Appeal held that "there is no right and certainly no constitutional right to cultivate medical marijuana."

The Court in <u>Maral</u> affirmed the ability of a local governmental entity to prohibit the cultivation of marijuana under its land use authority.

- E. The Federal Controlled Substances Act, 21 U.S.C. § 801 et seq., classifies marijuana as a Schedule 1 Drug, which is defined as a drug or other substance that has a high potential for abuse, that has no currently accepted medical use in treatment in the United State, and that has not been accepted as safe for use under medical supervision. The Federal Controlled Substances Act makes it unlawful under federal law for any person to cultivate, manufacture, distribute or dispense, or possess with intent to manufacture, distribute or dispense, marijuana. The Federal Controlled Substances Act contains no exemption for medical purposes, although there is recent case law that raises a question as to whether the Federal Government may enforce the Act where medical marijuana is allowed.
- F. On October 9, 2015 Governor Brown signed 3 bills into law (AB 266, AB 243, and SB 643) which collectively are known as the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act (hereafter "MMRSA"). The MMRSA set up a State licensing scheme for commercial medical marijuana uses while protecting local control by requiring that all such businesses must have a local license or permit to operate in addition to a State license. The MMRSA allows the City to completely prohibit commercial medical marijuana activities.
- G. The City Council finds that commercial medical marijuana (cannabis) activities, as well as cultivation for personal medical use as allowed by the CUA and MMP can adversely affect the health, safety, and well-being of City residents. Citywide prohibition is proper and necessary to avoid the risks of criminal activity, degradation of the natural environment, malodorous smells and indoor electrical fire hazards that may result from such activities. Further, as recognized by the Attorney General's August 2008 Guidelines for the Security and Non-Diversion of Marijuana Grown for Medical Use, marijuana cultivation or other concentration of marijuana in any location or premises without adequate security increases the risk that surrounding homes or businesses may be negatively impacted by nuisance activity such as loitering or crime.
- H. The limited immunity from specified state marijuana laws provided by the Compassionate Use Act and Medical Marijuana Program does not confer a land use right or the right to create or maintain a public nuisance.
- I. The MMRSA contains language that requires the city to prohibit cultivation uses by March 1, 2016 either expressly or otherwise under the principles of permissive zoning, or the State will become the sole licensing authority. The MMRSA also contains language that requires delivery services to be expressly prohibited by local ordinance, if the City wishes to do so. The MMRSA is silent as to how the City must prohibit other type of commercial medical marijuana activities.
- J. While the City Council believes that cultivation and all commercial medical marijuana (cannabis) uses are prohibited under the City's permissive zoning regulations, it desires to enact this ordinance to expressly make clear that all such uses are prohibited in all zones throughout the City.
- K. The Planning Commission held a duly noticed public hearing on December ___, 2015 at which time it considered all evidence presented, both written and oral and at the end of the hearing voted to adopt a resolution recommending that the City Council not adopt/adopt this Ordinance.
- L. The City Council held a duly noticed public hearing on this Ordinance on December ___, 2015, at which time it considered all evidence presented, both written and oral.

SECTION 2. AMENDED. Title 8, "HEALTH AND SAFETY" is hereby amended by adding Chapter 8.34, Entitled, "MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND CULTIVATION" to the Waterford Municipal Code to read as follows:

TITLE 8 CHAPTER 8.34

8.34.010 Definitions

"Cannabis" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(f) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Caregiver" or "primary caregiver" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Health & Safety Code § 11362.7 as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Commercial cannabis activity" shall have the same meaning as that set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(k) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Cooperative/Collective" shall mean two or more persons collectively or cooperatively cultivating, distributing, using, transporting, possessing, administering, delivering or making available medical marijuana, with or without compensation.

"Cultivation" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(I) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Cultivation site" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5 (x) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Delivery" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(m) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Dispensary" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(n) as the same may be amended from time to time. For purposes of this Chapter, "Dispensary" shall also include a cooperative/collective.

"Dispensing" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(o) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Distribution" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(p) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Distributor" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(q) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Manufacturer" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(y) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Manufacturing site" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(af) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Medical cannabis," "medical cannabis product," or "cannabis product" shall have the same meanings as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(ag) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act" or "MMRSA" shall mean the following bills signed into law on October 9, 2015 as the same may be amended from time to time: AB 243, AB 246, and SB 643.

"Nursery" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(ah) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Qualifying patient" or "Qualified patient" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Health & Safety Code § 11362.7 as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Testing laboratory" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(z) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Transport" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(am) as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Transporter" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Business & Professions Code § 19300.5(aa) as the same may be amended from time to time.

8.34.020 Prohibition.

- A. Commercial cannabis (marijuana) activities of all types are expressly prohibited in all zones, planned developments, and all specific and master plan areas in the City of Waterford. No person shall establish, operate, conduct or allow any commercial cannabis (marijuana) activity anywhere within the City.
- B. To the extent not already covered by subsection A above, all deliveries of medical cannabis (marijuana) are expressly prohibited within the City of Waterford. No person shall conduct any deliveries that either originate or terminate within the City.
- C. This section is meant to prohibit all activities for which a State license is required. Accordingly, the City shall not issue any permit, license or other entitlement for any activity for which a State license is required under the MMRSA.
- D. Cultivation of cannabis for non-commercial purposes including, but not limited to, cultivation by a qualified patient or a primary caregiver, is expressly prohibited in all zones, planned developments, and all specific and master plan areas in the City of Waterford. No person including, but not limited to, a qualified patient or primary caregiver, shall cultivate any amount of cannabis (marijuana) in the City, even for medical purposes.
- E. In the event that there is future legislation or an initiative that authorizes Recreational Marijuana (Cannabis), to the greatest extent permitted by law and to the extent not already prohibited by this Chapter and/or municipal code, the prohibitions contained herein (marijuana) shall apply to recreational marijuana (Cannabis)...

8.34.030 Public Nuisance.

Any use or condition caused, or permitted to exist, in violation of any provision of this Chapter shall be, and hereby is declared to be, a public nuisance and may be summarily abated by the City pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 731 or any other remedy available to the City.

8.34.040 Civil Penalties.

In addition to any other enforcement permitted by this Chapter, the City Attorney may bring a civil action for injunctive relief and civil penalties pursuant against any person or entity that violates this Chapter. In any civil action brought pursuant to this Chapter, a court of competent jurisdiction may award reasonable attorney's fees and costs to the prevailing party.

SECTION 3. AMENDED. Title 5, Chapter 5.04.020, entitled "BUSINESS LICENSE TAX" of the Waterford Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

TITLE 5 CHAPTER 5.04

5.04.020 License-Required/Prohibition

It is unlawful for any person to commence, establish, maintain or carry on any business enterprise whatever in the city without first obtaining a license from said city, whether said business enterprise or said person is subject to a city license tax under this chapter or not. (Ord. 71-2 §1, 1971). The city shall not approve licenses or uses for a medical marijuana (cannabis) collective, cooperative or dispensary. The city shall not approve licenses or uses for the distribution, cultivation, transportation, delivery, or processing of medical marijuana (cannabis). The city shall not approve licensees or uses for any activity that requires a license or any other authorization or approval under the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act.

SECTION 4. AMENDED. Title 17, "ZONING", CHAPTER 17.40, "GENERAL REGULATIONS" by adding Section 17.40.320 to the Waterford Municipal Code to read as follows:

TITLE 17 CHAPTER 17.40

17.40.320 Medical Marijuana and Cultivation

Cultivation of cannabis for non-commercial purposes or commercial purposes including, but not limited to, cultivation by a qualified patient or primary caregiver, is expressly prohibited in all zones, planned developments, and all zoning districts, as well as all specific and master plan areas in the City of Waterford. No person including, but not limited, a qualified patient or primary caregiver, shall cultivate any amount of cannabis (marijuana) in the city, even for medical purposes. In addition, all commercial cannabis (marijuana) activities of all types are expressly prohibited in all zones, planned developments, and all zoning districts as well as all specific and master plan areas in the City of Waterford. All deliveries of medical cannabis (marijuana_ are expressly prohibited within the city of Waterford.

SECTION 5. AUTHORITY. This ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authority granted by the California Constitution and State law, including but not limited to Article XI, Section 7 of the California Constitution, the Compassionate Use Act, the Medical Marijuana Program, and The Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act.

SECTION 6. PERMISSIVE ZONING SCHEME. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be interpreted to mean that the City's permissive zoning scheme allows any other use not specifically listed therein.

SECTION 7. CEQA. This ordinance is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15305, minor alterations in land use limitations in areas with an average slope of less than 20% that do not result in any changes in land use or density and section15061(b)(3) which is the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment and CEQA does not apply where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. The City's permissive zoning provisions already prohibits all uses that are being expressly prohibited by this ordinance. Therefore, this ordinance has no impact on the physical environment as it will not result in any changes.

SECTION 8. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 9. To the extent the provisions of the Waterford Municipal Code as amended by this Ordinance are substantially the same as the provisions of that Code as they read immediately prior to the adoption of this Ordinance, then those provisions shall be construed as continuations of the earlier provisions and not as new enactments.

SECTION 10. The City Clerk shall certify as to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause a summary thereof to be published within fifteen (15) days of adoption and shall post a certified copy of this Ordinance, including the vote for and against same, in the Office of the City Clerk, in accordance with Government Code Section 36933.

SECTION 11. ENACTMENT: Prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) days from the passage and adoption thereof, this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in the County of Stanislaus, State of California, together with names of the members of the City Council voting for and against the same.

An Ordinance Adding Waterford Municipal Code Section 13.18.010, entitled "Underground Service Alert"

SUMMARY:

The city council will consider adding a section to the code addressing the need for individuals to contact the Underground Service Alert (USA) organization prior to excavation of any kind. Approval of this item would add a new section to the code that previously did not exist.

FISCAL IMPACT:

N/A

ANALYSIS:

A Local Government Relations Representative from Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E) recently contacted city staff to request an addition to our ordinance related to the Underground Service Alert 811 call before you dig system. The representative advised that he had spoken to our construction inspector about the possibility of adding a section to our ordinance in hopes that it would encourage adherence to the Government Code requirement that excavators contact USA 811 prior to excavating.

USA North 811 provides a free and effective Damage Prevention Service that protects the communities and underground facilities in Central / Northern California, and Nevada. 811 is a free one-call service managed by USA North.

USA North 811 began operation in May of 1975 & incorporated as a 501 (c)(6) Non Profit Mutual Benefit Corporation in 1986. USA North 811's primary objective is to receive planned excavation reports from public or private excavators and to transmit those planned excavation reports to all of its' participating utility members, who may have facilities in and around that excavation site. The members will either: 1) mark or stake the horizontal path of their facility, 2) provide information about the location of their facility, or 3) advise the excavator of clearance, for facilities that they own.

Excerpt from the USA North California Excavation Manual:

Five Steps to a Safe Excavation

- 1. Survey and Mark: Survey your proposed excavation site. Make a list of affected operators of underground facilities (operators) at your job site, their needs and requirements. Mark the excavation site on paved surfaces with white spray chalk, water base, UV paint, or equivalent less permanent type marking; use flags, stakes, whiskers, etc. on unpaved surfaces, (Homeowners can use flour).
- 2. Call Before You Dig: Call USA North 2 working days; to 14 calendar days in California or to 28 calendar days in Nevada (legal notice) before you dig. Only operators who are members of the USA North program will be notified. Compare your list of affected operators determined in Step 1, with the list of operators notified by USA North. For your safety contact any operator at your job site that is not a member of USA North. USA North accepts design inquiry requests through its internet application only, call 1-800-640-5137 ext 2309 for more information.

- 3. Wait the Required Time: The legal 2 working days to 14 calendar days notice in California or to 28 calendar days in Nevada allows USA North members to examine their underground facility records and respond to you. Excavators are required by law to wait until all operator(s) of subsurface installations have provided a positive response to their excavation site. The positive response includes operator's marking, or staking the horizontal path of their facility with the appropriate color code, providing information about the location of their facility, or advising the excavator of clearance. Depending on our member's workload, they may contact you to try to negotiate a new start time for your excavation.
- 4. Respect the Marks: Preserve facility marks for the duration of the job. If any of the operator markings are not reasonably visible, you must call USA North and request remarking by the affected operator(s). A re-mark request requires a 2 working day notice. When you request an operator(s) to re-mark their facilities, you will be asked if your excavation site is still outlined in white, so the USA North members can respond to your request. Note: A USA North ticket is active for 28 calendar days in California and Nevada from the date of its issuance. You must have an active USA North ticket for the entire duration of your excavation.
- 5. Dig With Care: In California and Nevada hand excavate within 24" of the outside diameter of the facility. Facilities that are in conflict with your excavation are to be located with hand tools and protected before power equipment is used. Notify the affected operator(s) of any contact, scrape, dent, nick or damage to their facility.

City staff has prepared the attached ordinance for council consideration. City staff believes the proposed ordinance will better serve our current and future needs as it relates to the Underground Service Alert (USA) organization and their efforts.

Staff recommends adoption of the proposed ordinance.

PROCESS:

Ordinance 2015-09 was introduced for a first reading by title only at the December 17, 2015 City Council meeting as a public hearing item. City Council took action to approve the introduction and first reading and thereafter a summary of Ordinance 2015-09 was published in the Waterford News.

Ordinance 2015-09 is before the City Council tonight as a public hearing item to consider the 2nd reading and adoption by title only. After adoption and within 14 days of passage, the Ordinance Summary will be published in the Waterford News together with the names of the members of the City Council voting for and against same. This Ordinance will become effective and be in full force on and after thirty (30) days of its passage and adoption.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE WATERFORD CITY COUNCIL AMENDING WATERFORD MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 13, ENTITLED "PUBLIC SERVICES" BY ADDING CHAPTER 13.18, ENTITLED "UNDERGROUND SERVICES ALERT"

WHEREAS, the City of Waterford is amending Title 13, entitled "PUBLIC SERVICES" by adding Chapter 13.18, entitled "Underground Services Alert" to require all public and private utility agencies to be a member of the regional notification center for subsurface installations (Underground Services Alert).

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WATERFORD, COUNTY OF STANISLAUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Title 13, Chapter 13.18 entitled "Underground Services Alert", is hereby added to read as follows:

Stricken through text represents deletions to the Waterford Municipal Code, highlighted/<u>underlined</u> text represents additions to the Waterford Municipal Code.

TITLE 13 CHAPTER 13.18

13.18.010 Underground services alert

Each public or private utility agency shall be a member of the regional notification center for subsurface installations (Underground Services Alert) and shall field mark, at its sole cost and expense, the locations of its underground network facilities upon notification in accordance with the requirements of Section 4216 of the California Government Code, and any other applicable law.

SECTION 2. Validity: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, word, or phrase of this ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, word, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, words, or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. Enactment: This ordinance shall become effective and be in full force on and after thirty (30) days of its passage and adoption, and prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) days from the passage and adoption thereof, shall be published in the City of Waterford, County of Stanislaus, State of California, together with the names of the members of the City Council voting for and against the same.

Introduction of Ordinance to Adopt Revisions to the Water System Code - Title 4 Water, of the Waterford Municipal Code

SUMMARY:

The Water System chapter of the Municipal Code governs the water distribution and treatment services provided to customers by the City. The city council will consider revising various sections of the code to add sections, wording, and to bring it in line with current practices and requirements, due to the recent acquisition of the former City of Modesto owned and operated Waterford and Hickman Water Systems.

FISCAL IMPACT:

N/A

ANALYSIS:

Due to the recent acquisition of the Modesto and Hickman Water Systems, staff has found various areas of the Water Code that are in need of addition, deletion, revision, or modification.

The attached document incorporates a number of revisions and was completed to primarily update technical information, clarify language, and bring it in line with current practices and requirements that are currently in place. The revisions also add sections to the code that previously did not exist.

Many additions are being suggested. Most notable are additions addressing metered services, connections, maintenance of lines, temporary services, water conservation, existing water wells, damage to water facilities, access to customer premises, installation of services, prohibited acts, water conservation, and water shortages.

These revisions were circulated within various departments of the city for comment. If any were received, they were incorporated.

City staff believes the proposed revisions will result in a more complete and comprehensive ordinance that will better serve our current and future needs. Staff recommends adoption of the proposed ordinance changes.

PROCESS:

Ordinance 2016-01 was introduced for a first reading by title only at the December 17, 2015 City Council meeting as a public hearing item. City Council took action to approve the introduction and first reading and thereafter a summary of Ordinance 2016-01 was published in the Waterford News.

Ordinance 2016-01 is before the City Council tonight as a public hearing item to consider the 2nd reading and adoption by title only. After adoption and within 14 days of passage, the Ordinance Summary will be published in the Waterford News together with the names of the members of the City Council voting for and against same. This Ordinance will become effective and be in full force on and after thirty (30) days of its passage and adoption.

WHEREAS, the City of Waterford is amending Chapter 4.00, entitled "REGULATION AND BILLING" and Chapter 4.06, entitled "WATER SHORTAGE REGULATIONS" by amending and adding various sections to WMC Chapter 4.00 and Chapter 4.06 specifically by adding WMC sections 4.00.015, 4.00.025, 4.00.045, 4.00.075, 4.00.100, 4.00.115, 4.00.125, 4.00.150, 4.00.160, 4.00.180, 4.00.190, 4.00.200, 4.001.205, 4.00.210, 4.00.235, 4.00.250, 4.00.255, 4.00.260, 4.00.265, 4.00.270, 4.00.275, 4.00.280, 4.00.290, 4.00.300, 4.00.310, 4.00.320, 4.00.330, 4.06.005 and by amending WMC sections 4.00.010, 4.00.040, 4.00.070, 4.00.110, 4.06.010.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WATERFORD, COUNTY OF STANISLAUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Title 4, "Water System" Chapter 4.00 entitled "Regulation and Billing", and Chapter 4.06 entitled "Water Shortage Regulations" are amended to read as follows:

TITLE 4 CHAPTER 4.00

Chapter 4.00 REGULATION AND BILLING

4.00.010 City to Own and Operate Water System

The city shall own and operate a water system serving designated areas within and outside of the corporate limits of the city and may construct new works as may be necessary to supply current and future users, within these areas, an adequate and safe domestic water supply. The City Council shall designate the areas which shall receive water service from the city water system.

4.00.0150 Authority.

The management, control and care of the municipal water system shall be vested in the public works director (director) in consultation with the city engineer, under the general direction of the city manager. (Ord. 05-01 §2).

4.00.020 Administration of funds.

The city manager shall be in charge of the collection of all money that may become due the city for water services and shall pay the same into the water fund, as provided for in Section 4.02.010. (Ord. 05-01 §2).

4.00.025 Definitions

For the purposes of this chapter, unless otherwise apparent from the context, certain words and phrases used in this chapter are defined as follows:

"Apartment" shall mean a room, living unit, or suite of rooms which is designed for, intended for, and/or occupied by one (1) family doing cooking therein.

"Business" shall mean a place wherein persons are engaged in the manufacture, processing, fabricating, servicing, selling, and/or buying for sale or resale of produce, articles, merchandise, or any goods whatsoever; and shall also apply to the rendering of service for compensation, whether as a trade or a profession.

"Church" shall mean a place of worship, whether as a part of another building or on separate property, and shall not include a parsonage, separate gymnasium, or classroom.

"Commercial service" shall mean and include any service that is not defined as a residential service or an industrial service.

"Connection charge" shall mean one (1) or more of the initial charges made at the time of connection to the City water system.

"Construction water" shall mean and include on-site water taken from fire hydrants and used for dust control or construction purposes. Permission must be granted by the City and fees paid.

"Cut water service" shall mean and include any service that has been physically disconnected from the City water system.

"Director" shall mean the Public Works Director or designee.

"Discontinued service" shall mean and include any service that has been shut off by the City at the City's curb stop or main.

"Dwelling" shall mean a building designed, occupied, or intended for living purposes and shall include single-family dwellings, buildings containing apartments, and rooming and/or lodging houses.

"Fire hydrant installation" shall mean the complete installation of a fire hydrant assembly.

"Industrial service" shall mean and include any service to a substantial industrial user as defined in WMC 7.04.015.

"Limited irrigation and sprinkling" shall mean limited irrigation and sprinkling for landscaping, beautification, small gardening, construction and dust control related to construction, and similar purposes only.

"Living unit" shall mean and include a dwelling designed for a single family.

"Lot" or a parcel of land shall mean a parcel of land consisting of one (1) or more contiguous lots of record in one (1) ownership to which service is provided for any purpose.

"Main" shall mean a water line six (6) inches or larger in diameter and appurtenant valves and fittings providing water to one (1) or more laterals or service connections.

"Meter" shall mean all of the equipment, electronics and parts needed to complete the installation of a water meter per City specifications including any automatic meter reading (AMR) device.

"Mobile home park" shall mean any lot or parcel of land where one (1) or more sites are rented or leased or intended to be rented or leased, with or without compensation, to accommodate mobile homes or recreational vehicles.

"New service" shall mean and include any new water service that is connected to the City water system.

"Pipeline" shall mean all water mains and services constructed in or under City streets.

"Residence" shall mean a dwelling designed to be occupied by a single family.

"Residential service" shall mean and include any service that conveys water to a single-family residence.

"Residential fire sprinklers" shall mean a wet pipe sprinkler system only designed for one (1) and two (2) family residences and manufactured homes.

"Service connection" Service connection" or "water service connection" means any tap, pipe, or other means of taking water from the city water distribution system. A service connection occurs at the time that a tap, pipe, or other means of taking water is physically attached to the city water distribution system in a manner capable of taking water from the distribution system.

"Services" shall mean and include any water line connected to the City water main that conveys water from the City system to private property.

"Water system" or "system" shall mean any city owned and operated water system, which includes, but is not limited to, wells, storage tanks, main water lines, fire hydrants, and any and all connections, valves, plumbing, and appurtenances thereto, located within the designated and permitted service area.

"Water service area" shall mean the area located within the city limits as such limits now or may from time to time exist, and those areas outside the city limits that have been approved for water service by the city council consistent with applicable water right restrictions.

4.00.040 Metered services.

- A. All service shall be equipped with meters prior to a certificate of occupancy being issued and shall be charged for water on the metered rate as specified in Chapter 4.02.
 - B. The cost of installation of the meter shall be paid by the user of the water. (Ord. 05-01 §2).
- C. The City shall approve the type and installation of all meters.
- D. The City shall provide and install any meter the City deems necessary with ten (10) days' written notice to the tenant and the owner for any service and may thereafter charge for water at metered rates.
- E. New water services shall be metered at the time of construction.
- F. All installed water meters and meter reading equipment shall become the property of the City. The retrofit of existing water services shall be performed by the City at the City's expense.
- G. The City may install all meters and meter reading equipment at the builder's expense for all new construction.
- H. If an installed water meter proves to be defective and does not correctly measure the amount of water consumed, the city shall install a new meter, and the water rate for the billing period while the meter was not operating correctly shall be the average water rate for the twelve billing periods previous to the malfunction of the original meter.

I. If a meter or appurtenances are damaged by the carelessness or negligence of the owner or occupant of the premises, the city will repair the meter, and the cost of such repairs shall be charged against the owner of the property and, if not paid within thirty days, shall then become a lien against said property.

J. The customer receiving city water service shall keep water meters unobstructed and accessible for reading, maintenance and repair, and shall provide the department's employees and/or its contractors access to the premises where the customer receives water service as may be required by the city for such purposes. Compliance with this section shall be a condition of receiving or continuing to receive city water service.

K. Any metered customer may request in writing that the meter through which water is being furnished be examined and tested by the city to determine whether the meter is registering accurately the amount of water that is being delivered through it. Upon receipt of such request, the city shall examine and test the meter. If the meter is found to register over three percent more water than actually passes through it, the customer's water bill will be adjusted accordingly. If the meter is found to register a variance of three percent or less, no billing adjustment will be made. Meter testing will be performed at a customer's request, at no charge to the customer, not more than once every twelve (12) months.

L. If a customer requests more frequent testing, the customer's request shall be accompanied by a deposit of an amount equal to the monthly minimum meter charge. Upon receipt of such request, the city shall examine and test the meter. If the meter is found to register over three percent more water than actually passes through it, the customer's water bill will be adjusted accordingly and the deposit shall be returned, without interest. If the meter is found to register a variance of three percent or less, no billing adjustment will be made and the deposit shall be used by the city to pay its inspection and testing costs.

4.00.045 Water Meter Use—Indemnity and Notification

threat to the public health:

No person other than authorized employees of the city or other persons authorized by the director shall install, maintain, repair, move, replace, adjust, tamper with, manipulate, damage, disconnect, or remove any water meter. Any person performing any of the foregoing actions, whether or not authorized by the director, shall indemnify and hold harmless city, its officers, and employees from any claims, actions, costs (including attorney fees), damages, or other liability resulting or arising from such actions, and shall pay the city's costs of investigating and repairing any resulting damage or replacing any removed items. Customers with metered water service connections shall notify the city of any visible damage to, or removal of, any portion of the meter box containing the water meter.

4.00.070 State connection regulations—Backflow control devices.

- A. In making plumbing connections, the consumer shall comply with the regulations of the state and county departments of public health.
 In addition to the applicable state and county regulations, the following is prohibited, unlawful and a misdemeanor subject to punishment in accordance with Chapter 1.12 of this code, because of the
- a. Unprotected cross connections between a public supply and any unapproved source of water; and
- b. Water service to premises where there is a possibility of contaminated water backflowing into the public water system.
- 2. In addition, approved reduced pressure valves (back flow protectors) shall be installed on water services when:
- a. Another source of water, whether cross connected or not, is in use or is available for use; or

- b. Containing liquid substances of any kind are used, produced, or processed.
- B. The director shall determine the type, design and layout of backflow control devices required at each premises, and the devices shall be installed at the expense of the consumer. The control devices shall be inspected, tested, and approved by the director as a condition of services to the premises. (Ord. 05-01-§2).

4.00.070 Connections

- (a) All off-site water lines or water lines within a public utility easement, connections, valves, plumbing, and appurtenant water facilities and the construction and installation thereof shall be constructed or installed at the consumer's expense and shall be to City standards and approved by the City Engineer prior to water service turn-on.
- (b) One (1) City water connection shall be provided to each lot, unless otherwise approved by the City Engineer and Public Works Director or their designee. All off-site lines shall be constructed to City standards.
- (c) No lot line adjustment, parcel map, or similar instrument shall be approved or recorded until the City has verified that separate City water services have been provided to each lot or parcel, except that the installation of a separate City water service at a vacant lot or premises may be postponed until the issuance of a building permit.
- (d) For each project, individual shutoff valves, gate valves, and necessary on-site lines under private ownership shall be provided.
- (e) The Building Official shall have tested and inspect the mains and services on private property unless an agreement is reached with the City Engineer and the Building Official to have the City Engineer arrange to test and inspect. The City Engineer shall have tested and inspect the water mains for the general distribution system whenever such mains are within the City right-of-way or public utility easement.
- (f) No person shall supply water in any way for use outside of the premises to which the service is assigned, except by permission of the Public Works Director.

4.00.075 Service Connections Generally

- A. Unless otherwise provided in this chapter, each lot or parcel shall have a separate water service connection, except for fire service connections serving more than one lot or parcel that are authorized pursuant to the municipal code or provisions of this chapter. All water service lines shall be equipped with an approved corporation stop/valve at the distribution main, and with a curb stop valve unless not required under specifications adopted by the city. Water service lines shall not cross another lot or parcel without first obtaining any and all rights-of-way, easements, or other approvals necessary to do so.
- B. To be eligible for water service, the property to which service is to be provided must abut a dedicated public easement or a city right-of-way in which a distribution main is constructed at a point immediately adjacent to the property, unless the director authorizes the extension of a distribution main.
- C. The director may authorize water service for land locked parcels provided that the customer obtains recorded private easements from the affected owner(s) and all other applicable legal requirements are fulfilled. Private easements must abut a distribution main in a dedicated public easement or city right-of-way. Water service lines constructed in private easements are private water lines, and the city shall have no responsibility for the maintenance and repair of such lines.

D. The director may authorize water service for a parcel that is not adjacent to a distribution main and is not land locked, on such terms and conditions as may be specified by the director, if the director determines based on written findings that it is not feasible to extend a distribution main due to the unique physical characteristics of the parcel which are so unusual that complying with the requirements of this section would create an exceptional hardship to the parcel owner or the surrounding parcel owners.

E.Except as provided herein, the director shall determine the maximum sizes of service connections. For single-family domestic service connections, the maximum size shall be one inch, or one and one-half inches if residential fire sprinkler systems are present, unless otherwise authorized by the director.

F. All water service connections are subject to the city's tap, meter, development, abandonment, and other applicable fees established by city council resolution, and to the city's cross-connection control standards.

4.00.100 Temporary Water Service.

A. The city shall adopt a written temporary water use policy that establishes policies, procedures, and requirements applicable to temporary water service, including procedures governing application for and issuance, denial, renewal, and revocation of fire hydrant use permits, and procedures for payment and forfeiture of deposits.

B. Any person requesting temporary water use shall comply with all requirements of the temporary water use policy, including the payment of all applicable fees, charges, and deposits in the amounts established by city council resolution.

C. Temporary water service shall be provided through a meter, at current city charges. The city may authorize temporary water service for new residential construction prior to meter installation, upon payment, prior to issuance of a building permit, of a temporary water service fee, for each residential lot, equal to three times the city's then-current monthly flat rate for water service to a single-family residence.

4.00.110 Open access to connections.

—— Access to service connections and water meters must be provided at all times. (Ord. 05-01 §2).

A customer receiving city water service shall provide the city's employees and contractors access to and use of the premises where city water service is received as may be required for the installation, maintenance, repair, or removal of any pipelines, water meters, and other appurtenances used to provide or measure city water service to the customer's premises or to adjacent premises; or for purposes of connecting, reconnecting, or relocating the connection for city water service to any such premises. Compliance with the foregoing requirements is a condition of the customer receiving or continuing to receive city water service, and the department may shut off water service at the distribution main if the customer refuses to allow access as required in this section. If the customer refuses to allow such access, the city may seek authorization for access from any court of competent jurisdiction.

4.00.115 Leaking Fixtures

It is unlawful for any person to maintain or allow on his or her premises leaky or faulty water fixtures or water using or distributing devices to which city water is connected, so that city water is wasted thereby. The failure to repair or disconnect the faulty device within five days after being notified in writing to do so by the department shall be sufficient cause for the disconnection of city water from the premises until the repairs have been made. After disconnection, water shall be reconnected only in accordance with the provisions of this code.

4.00.125 Access to Customer Premises—Compliance

A customer receiving city water service shall provide the department's employees and/or contractors access to and use of the premises where city water service is received as may be required by the city's employees or contractors to determine whether there is any violation of any of the provisions of this code, or to abate any violation thereof. If the customer refuses to allow such access, the city may seek authorization from any court of competent jurisdiction for such access and abatement. Compliance with the provisions of this article shall be a condition of the customer receiving or continuing to receive city water service.

4.00.150 Installation and Maintenance of Services

A. An application for the installation, relocation and/or change in size of service shall be submitted and the appropriate fees paid prior to any work being done.

B. Where a City-owned main or lateral is in service, new services, relocations and/or changes in size for any service, the property owner/developer shall have any work done by a licensed plumbing contractor. The City may install, relocate or change in size any service up to two inches (2") if staff is available and upon deposit of an amount equal to the estimated cost of the work; i.e., labor, equipment, materials, including meter, if required, and overhead. If the actual cost is greater than the estimate, the developer will be billed the difference; if the cost is less, the excess will be refunded.

C. All meters and meter boxes shall be approved by the City prior to installation. At the developer's request and upon receipt of payment, the City may supply any meter, including box, up to two inches (2") in size. Any meters larger than two inches (2") must be supplied by the developer including the meter box. The City will maintain all meters. The City may charge a maintenance fee for the maintenance of the meters. Said maintenance fee shall be set by resolution of the City Council.

D. The City will maintain services from the water main to the water meter or meter idler, whichever occurs first, within the City right-of-way or public utility easement. Any service, irrespective of any other portion of this Code, that is not located within the City right-of-way or public utility easement shall be maintained by the consumer.

4.00.160 When City Will Furnish Water

When mains and laterals are in place or within a reasonable distance from a particular parcel, the City will furnish water service from such line to the back of the sidewalk if a sidewalk is in place or to the property line.

4.00.170 Multiple Consumer Developments

If more than one (1) consumer is served from one (1) service connection, the owner of the property or his agent shall be required to sign for and guarantee the payment of such service connection, and the owner shall be liable for all water served through such connection, except that a project, association, corporation, or other governing body shall be responsible for the payment of water charges to the City.

4.00.180 Easements when Lines are on Private Property

When a line is to be constructed across private property to serve more than one (1) parcel of land, a utility easement shall be granted to the City, and the easement line, size, and installation shall be approved by the City Engineer and Public Works Director.

4.00.190 Maintenance of Lines

The City will maintain all mains and appurtenances within City rights-of-way on City property or easements including curb valves and meters. The property owner shall maintain all service connection lines and appurtenances to or on his property up to the meter or curb valve.

4.00.200 Damage to Water System Facilities

The customer shall be liable for any damage to the city-owned water service facilities when such damage is from causes originating on the premises by an act of the customer or his tenants, agents, employees, contractors, licensees or permittees, including the breaking or destruction of locks by the customer or others on or near a meter, and any damage to a meter that may result from hot water or steam from a boiler or heater on the customer's premises. The city shall be reimbursed by the customer for all charges related to any such damage.

4.00.205 Damage to City Water Distribution System

Any person or entity damaging or removing any portion of the city water distribution system shall pay the city's costs of investigating and repairing such damage and/or replacing any removed item(s), and shall indemnify and hold harmless city, its officers and employees from any claims, actions, costs (including attorney fees), damages or other liability resulting or arising from such damage or removal.

4.00.210 Prohibited Acts

- (a) No person shall make, or cause to be made, a connection with, or tamper or interfere with in any manner, the City water system, without first obtaining a permit from the City.
- (b) No person shall turn on or off, otherwise interfere with, or cause to be turned on or off or otherwise interfered with, any part or portion of the City water system, without first obtaining a permit from the City.
- (c) No person shall install or connect with the water system any evaporative type air-conditioning cooler or unit unless it is equipped with a recirculation pump and equipped with a thermostat or pressure control valve properly adjusted to regulate the flow of cooling water through the units so that the minimum amount of cooling water, as determined by the manufacturer's specifications, shall be used.
- (d) No person shall connect to the water system any refrigerating or air-conditioning equipment unless such equipment is air-cooled or has a water tower or evaporation condenser so that only makeup water is used.
- (e) No person shall waste water.
- (f) No Person shall install or maintain any pipe, faucet, hose bib, fixture, or appliance connected to the water system in such condition or state of disrepair that water may be or is lost or wasted.
- (g) No Person shall supply City water to anyone without City authorization, and no person shall use City water without authorization or without paying the required fees. The City shall have the right, upon five (5) days' written notice to cease, to disconnect the water service for the person supplying the water.
- (h) No person shall construct a bypass around any meter or service without the prior consent of the City.
- (i) No person shall use water for any purpose by the method of "return wells" wherein water is discharged into a well so that such water is injected into a water-bearing strata below a depth of fifty (50') feet below the surface of the ground.
- (j) No person shall steal, take, carry away, transport, lead, drive away, or cause the same to be done, water from the City water system.

- (k) No person shall fraudulently appropriate, or cause to be fraudulently appropriated, or by any false or fraudulent representation or pretense appropriate water from the City water system.
- (I) No person shall make unauthorized repairs to the City water system.
- (m) No person or water user shall turn on or reconnect a water meter or water connection turned off or disconnected by the city.
- (n) No water user using water supplied by the city shall supply any other person with such water or allow any other person the use of such water from the water user's water connection, or permit a further connection to be made to the water user's connection on his or any other premises, unless authorized by the public works director.
- (o) No person shall appropriate water for use in the commission of a crime.
- (p) All persons shall abide by the restrictions contained in WMC.

4.00.235 Tampering with Fire Hydrants

It is unlawful for any person to operate, alter, change, remove, disconnect, connect with, or interfere in any manner with any fire hydrant owned or used by the city without first obtaining written permission from the Public Works Director.

4.00.250 Unusual or Uncommon Quantities of Water

When an abnormally large, unusual, or uncommon quantity of water is desired for filling a swimming pool or for any other purposes, an application on a city form must be filed and approved by the city prior to taking such water. The granting of permission to take water in unusual quantities will be given only if it can be safely delivered through the city's facilities and if other consumers are not inconvenienced or impacted thereby and the appropriate charges are paid.

4.00.255 Water Service for Community Gardens

The director may authorize lots or parcels utilized for a community garden, to use the existing water service connection of an adjoining lot or parcel to provide irrigation for the community garden if the owner of the adjoining lot or parcel consents to such use, provided that:

- A. A backflow prevention device is installed and periodically tested in accordance with such requirements as may be specified by the director to protect the potable water supply of the city and of the adjoining lot or parcel served by the existing water service connection; and
- B. A water meter is installed on the existing water service connection. The owner of the adjoining lot or parcel served by the existing water service connection shall notify the director prior to the initiation of any such use, and shall be liable for all rates, charges, and fees for the water service furnished to the existing water service connection used to provide irrigation for the community garden.

4.00.260 Responsibility for Equipment

The customer shall, at his own risk and expense, furnish, install and keep in good and safe condition all equipment that may be required for receiving, controlling, applying and utilizing water, and the city shall not be responsible for any loss or damage caused by the improper installation of such equipment, or the negligence or wrongful act of the customer or of any of his tenants, agents, employees, contractors, licensees or permit holders in installing, maintaining, or operating or interfering with such equipment. The

city shall not be responsible for damage to property caused by faucets, valves, and other equipment that are open when water is turned on either originally or when turned on after a temporary shutdown.

When leaky faucets or fixtures are discovered and not immediately repaired, the water service may be disconnected.

4.00.265 Inspections

No person shall interfere with the inspection by city employees of any water fixture or water-using or water-distributing device connected directly or indirectly to the city water distribution system, for the purpose of determining whether there is a violation of any provision of this chapter. City employees shall obtain the consent of an adult occupant before entering occupied premises or dwellings. If consent is not obtained, the city may seek authorization for access from any court of competent jurisdiction.

4.00.270 No City Responsibility Beyond Point of Service—Indemnity.

The city's responsibility to operate, maintain and repair public water mains shall extend only to the point of service. The operation, maintenance and repair of any private water line connected to the point of service shall be the customer's sole responsibility. The customer shall indemnify and hold harmless city, its officers and employees from any claims, actions, costs (including attorney fees), damages or other liability resulting or arising from the condition, operation, maintenance or repair of said private water line.

4.00.275 Fire and Other Emergencies

Nothing in this article shall be construed to apply to the use of city water for purposes of extinguishing fire or any other similar emergency

4.00.280 City Water Use

The City of Waterford, and its officers, employees, and agents when acting in the course and scope of their employment, shall be exempt from the provisions of this article; provided, however, that the City Manager shall promulgate administrative regulations governing water use by the city, and its officers, employees, and agents, as may be necessary for the city to achieve the conservation of water resources equal to or greater than the level of conservation achieved by the city's water service customers.

4.00.290 Water Wells

No water well shall be drilled or reconstructed within the City without the consent of the City. When City water is available and a request to connect to the City system has been approved, or a request to reconstruct a well has been made, the existing non-City-owned well on the property shall be capped and plugged in accordance with State regulations, unless otherwise authorized by the City.

4.00.300 Existing Water Wells

The use and maintenance of existing water wells within the city water system service area shall be allowed.

4.00.310 Water Well, Use of; When Permitted

The use of water wells within the limits of the city for potable purposes shall be permitted only when a public water system is not available to the premises on which water is required. A public water system shall, for the purposes of this chapter, be considered available when a water distribution main which can be tapped is located within 200 feet radius of any part of said premises on which water is required.

4.00.320 Limitations Upon Well Drilling Permits

Permits for water wells issued after the effective date of the ordinance codified in this chapter shall be subject to the following limitations:

A. Wells shall not be drilled nor the water produced therefrom used for residential, commercial or industrial land use activities except that replacement well(s) for residential, commercial and/or industrial land uses may be established for well(s) which existed and were in active use prior to the effective date of this chapter; provided, that no net increase in water production results from the replacement well(s).

- B. All property owners with approved well permits pursuant to this chapter shall meter the well's water production and report the amount of groundwater extracted each calendar year. This report shall be submitted to the city no later than March 1st on a form approved by the city. The property owner shall maintain the water production meter in sound operating condition at all times.
- C. All property owners with wells approved pursuant to this chapter shall meter the well's water level on a monthly basis and submit such water level data to the city on a form approved by the city. This report shall be submitted annually to the city prior to March 1st of each year. The property owner shall maintain the meter to measure the water level in sound operating condition at all times.
- D. As a condition of all approved well permits pursuant to this chapter, the permittee shall assume all liability imposed by law for personal injury or property damage resulting from any work performed by the permittee or his agent under a permit, or resulting from the failure of the permittee to perform his obligation under a permit. If any claim of such liability is made against the city, its officers, employees, or agents, the permittee shall defend, indemnify and hold them, and each of them, harmless from such claims.

4.00.330 Notice and Order to Discontinue Use or Decommission

Whenever a water well is determined by the city to have an unsafe water sample, pose a significant health or safety hazard, or pose a risk of groundwater contamination, the city may issue a stop use order, order the water well repaired, require the water to be treated to reduce health or safety risks, or order the water well to be decommissioned. Such notice shall be served by certified or registered mail, or in person, to the last known owner of the property. If the city orders the water well to be decommissioned, such decommissioning must be completed within 90 days. Upon failure of the owner to comply with such order, the city may cause such water well to be repaired, treated, or decommissioned at the cost and expense of the owner of the property upon which such water well is located.

TITLE 4 CHAPTER 4.06

Chapter 4.06 WATER SHORTAGE REGULATIONS

4.06.005 Water Conservation-Intent

The city council finds and determines:

- A. To prevent waste and ensure reasonable use of water supplied by the city water distribution system, it is necessary and desirable to enact certain limitations to promote water conservation by city customers.
- B. These limitations should be focused on outdoor water use, because the maximum demands for water from the city's water distribution system occur during the summer months, with outdoor irrigation use exceeding all other demands.
- C. Water use limitations should be designed to promote the use of drip irrigation and other low volume irrigation methods that reduce outdoor water use by applying water more efficiently than traditional irrigation methods.

- D. Reduction of water use through water conservation protects and promotes the public health, safety and welfare by conserving a vital resource that is subject to ever-increasing demands.
- E. Reduction of water demands through water conservation will reduce the per capita amount of water used by city customers, and also will reduce the city's costs for electrical energy, equipment and chemicals utilized to pump and treat water supplied to the city water distribution system.
- F. By reducing the use of electrical energy, equipment and chemicals, the reduction of water demands through water conservation also protects and promotes the public health, safety and welfare by reducing greenhouse gas emissions associated with the production and transport of electrical energy, equipment and chemicals.

4.06.010 Declaration of emergency.

It is hereby found and declared that a water shortage and emergency exists within the water source and service area of the water department of the city of Waterford, and that it is necessary to prohibit and regulate water uses as provided in this chapter. (Ord. 05-01 §5, 2005).

4.06.010 Declaration of Water Shortage

In response to any condition necessitating increased water conservation, such as a water shortage due to drought, natural disaster, or other reduction of water supply availability, or as may otherwise be required to protect the public health, safety, and welfare, the city council may by resolution declare the existence of a water shortage and impose revised and additional limitations and time restrictions on outdoor water use. While the declaration of water shortage remains in effect, no person shall use, or cause to be used, city water in violation of such limitations or restrictions. Unless the resolution specifies an ending date, the declaration of water shortage shall remain in effect until rescinded or otherwise modified by subsequent resolution of the city council. While a declaration of water shortage is in effect, any requirement in the Planning and Development Code to plant or irrigate trees, shrubs, or other groundcover, or for groundcover to be living, is suspended.

SECTION 2. Validity: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, word, or phrase of this ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, word, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, words, or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. Enactment: This ordinance shall become effective and be in full force on and after thirty (30) days of its passage and adoption, and prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) days from the passage and adoption thereof, shall be published in the City of Waterford, County of Stanislaus, State of California, together with the names of the members of the City Council voting for and against the same.

The foregoing ordinance was passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Waterford, County of Stanislaus, State of California, at a regular meeting thereof held on the 7th day of January, 2016.

Successor Agency Finding of Completion and Long-Range Property Management Plan Update

SUMMARY:

The Department of Finance has issued a Finding of Completion for the dissolution of the former Waterford Redevelopment Agency now that the final payment of \$137,640 has been remitted to the County Auditor Controller. The Department of Finance also approved the 2013 submitted Long-Range Property Management Plan now authorizing the sale of 12717 Welch St.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Finding of Completion cost the General Fund \$137,640 of which approximately 10% will be remitted to the City of Waterford as an eligible pass-through agency. The Finding of Completion will now allow the Successor Agency to repay loans to the General Fund over time as sufficient tax increment is made available totaling nearly \$150,000, and enable the City to sell the vacant property at 12717 Welch St as required by the dissolution process adding to the general fund about \$25,000.

SUMMARY:

The dissolution bill of AB 1X26 requires the re-adoption of a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule by the Successor Agency to the Waterford Redevelopment Agency. The schedule details the payments for the next fiscal year including the 1997 loan obligation payment and for administration expenses.

FISCAL IMPACT:

ANALYSIS:

The Successor Agency owes a total of \$248,011 in payments through June 30, 2017. The payments are noted in the attached schedule, and are all noted irrespective of anticipated revenues. Included in the schedule totals are the amounts owed to the City of Waterford for deficits covered by the City.

At June 30, 2015 the cumulative deficit amount was \$148,761 and is expected to grow to approximately \$165,761 by the end of the June 30, 2016. The Waterford City Council acting as Successor Agency is not obligated to cover any deficits beyond the debt service, although including actual administrative charges allows the funds to be recaptured sometime in the future, otherwise a burden of the General Fund. The growing deficit is an on-going concern, as anticipated in electing to become the Successor Agency.
