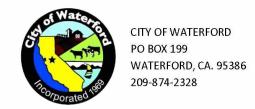

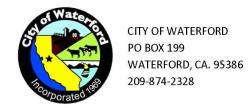

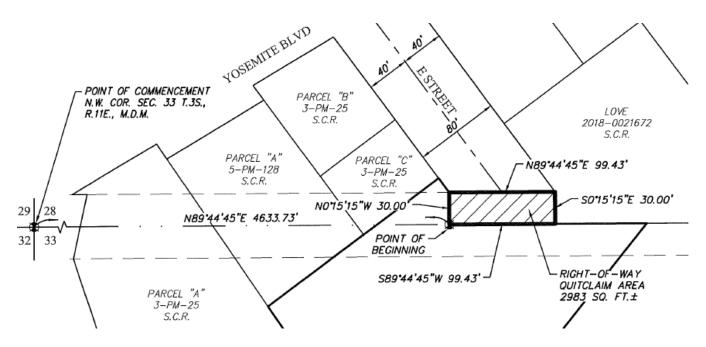

SUMMARY:

Consider the approval of the execution of a quit claim deed abandoning an unimproved portion of S. E Street right of way.

ANALYSIS:

In February 2022, the Planning Commission approved Conditional Use Permit 2021-01 for the development of APN 080-035-008 into 21,000 square foot self-storage facility composed of ten (10) metal buildings and a 684 square foot one (1) story office and caretaker building. The project is in design and their Engineer and Land Surveyor noted that an old road reservation running south of Yosemite Blvd (SR 132) behind the Waterford Market and Old City Public Works property that had been abandoned in the past. When an abandonment is processed, half the road reservation goes to the properties on each side. In this case, half the road reservation abandonment adjacent to E Street went to the City of Waterford.



As this portion of unimproved E Street is not needed by the city and has no value if sold on the open market, Staff recomends we quit claim the right of way to the developer of the storage project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

As this property has no value if sold on the open market, the fiscal impact is effectively zero.

As per our meeting a few weeks ago, I am writing to you to request the City execute the attached Quit Claim Deed releasing any interest the City may have in the subject property, to my client. Following is the background and history to explain our request.

According to the assessor's office my client owns APN 080-035-008, which includes the entirety of the portion of the abandoned Hickman Road which passes through our parcel. Our original architectural site layout was based on that premise. This seemed odd to me because the normal practice is to give half of the abandoned street to each adjacent property. In reviewing the actual deed to our property, we only own to the center of the abandoned street and reviewing the deeds to our neighbor's property (APN 134-012-013) they also own to the center of the abandoned street, so the assessor's plat is wrong.

As we discussed in our meeting, the property in question is the abandoned half street adjacent to the end of south "E" Street. Normal practice would say that, that portion goes to the adjacent owner, which in this case would be the City of Waterford, due to it being adjacent to "E" Street. However, it goes against logic to abandon a street to a street. This is probably why the Assessor's office has shown it the way they have and why my client is paying property tax on it.

I believe it makes sense for my client to maintain possession of the subject property but in order to feel comfortable doing so, we are requesting the City execute and record the attached Quit Claim Deed.

We have attached the modified project site plan so you can see how we will utilize the property. Obviously, my client will pay any costs that may be incurred by the City.

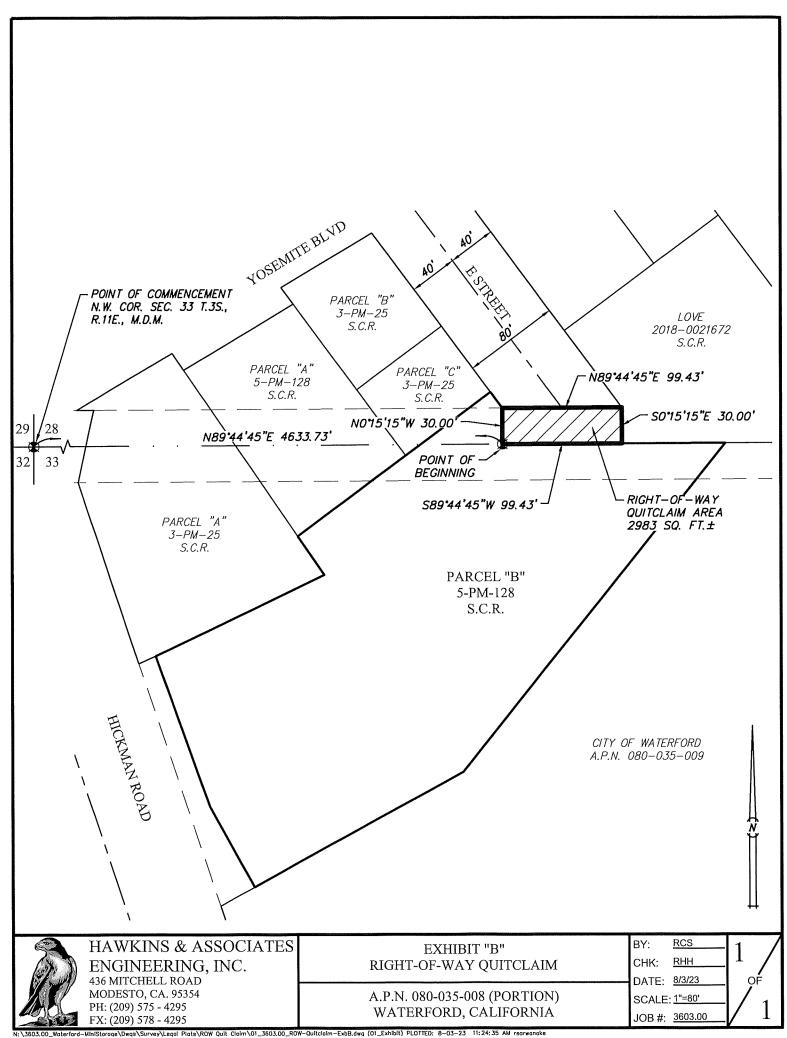

SUMMARY:

Awarding Bid and Approving an Agreement with Lechowicz & Tseng Municipal Consultants of Alameda, California in the Amount of \$24,860 for a Wastewater Rate and Fee Study and authorizing the City Manager to execute the Professional Services Agreement.

ANALYSIS:

With the Council's direction, the City of Waterford put out a Request for Proposal on August 3, 2023 for the purpose of conducting a "Wastewater Rate and Fee Study." The intent of the study is to independently assess and evaluate the City's current wastewater rates and create a simple, equitable, and legal new rate structure to meet the financial needs of the City's wastewater enterprise fund. It is staff's intent for the proposed rate structure to adequately fund the utility's operating and capital improvement needs.

The study is expected to be based on a comprehensive review of the City's wastewater enterprise funds, historical statements of revenue and expense, current year budgets, customer counts and classes, historical usage data, planned future growth, and any other information deemed important. The results of the study and the resulting proposed rate structure shall provide the foundation for wastewater rates for the next five years. The rates and rate structures proposed must fully meet Proposition 218 and all other legal requirements.

The vast majority of wastewater is received from residential customers. The collection system is comprised of clay or polyvinyl chloride pipe varying in size from 6 inches to 12 inches. Wastewater is conveyed by gravity lines as well as force mains from 4 lift stations to the wastewater treatment plant for treatment through a series of 5 ponds. The current wastewater treatment plant has a 1 MGD capacity and currently treats an average flow of .58 MGD. Treated wastewater is then pumped under the Tuolumne River to the City's percolation ponds.

The current wastewater rate schedule was put in place in 2016. Currently, rates are fixed based on various units of measure for various uses.

On September 29, 2023, three (3) proposals were received by the City for the Wastewater Rate and Fee Study.

Lechowicz & Tseng Municipal Consultants (L&T) is pleased to submit a proposal for the Wastewater Rate and Fee Study for the City of Waterford (City). We enjoyed working with you to complete the previous wastewater rate study in 2019 and appreciate the potential opportunity to work with you again. Our approach to the 2023 update is to review operating results since the last study and revise the cost of service as appropriate. We envision this project as a streamlined update given our existing knowledge of the City's wastewater utility.

Since we last worked together, L&T has continued to grow our expertise and staffing. We now have four staff members, two principals and two staff analysts. We propose to assign Alison Lechowicz as project manager to provide continuity for the City and Peter Carey as financial analyst. Peter is headquartered about 30 miles away in the City of Merced. As a firm, we have continued to focus on providing rate studies for small public agencies. Recent assignments in the Central Valley include studies for the Cities of Chowchilla, Hanford (ongoing), Kerman, Kingsburg, and Wasco, the Root Creek Water District (Madera County), the McMullin Area Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA; Fresno County), and South Fork Kings GSA (Kings County). We have also conducted financial modeling work for the Fresno Irrigation District. L&T will bring our experience from these projects to our work for the City of Waterford.

To provide a comprehensive analysis, L&T will focus on the following:

o Financial Analysis: L&T analyzes revenue streams to meet immediate cash flow needs as well as plan for future capital projects, deferred maintenance, and accumulation of appropriate reserves. We will provide the City with a dashboard of financial variables that will clearly illustrate how various considerations, such as grant vs. loan funding, funding capital needs, and high vs. low inflation among others will impact the wastewater utility's cash flow. As a registered municipal financial advisor, we can also conduct detailed reviews of debt obligations and debt capacity. L&T will provide financing alternatives for funding upcoming capital costs. Our final report will provide the City with a financial roadmap that fully documents the cost of service.

- Wastewater Rate Design: L&T will ensure the City's rate structures achieves compliance with Proposition 218 proportionality requirements. We understand that the City wishes to maintain its current rate structure. Therefore, L&T will update the underlying flow and loading assumptions for each customer class. Our final documents will stress the value of the City's infrastructure, explain why costs are increasing, and describe cost saving measures.

We very much enjoyed working with the City in the past, and we appreciate the potential opportunity to assist the City with this study. 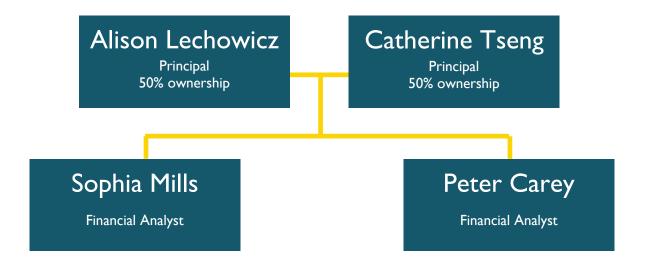

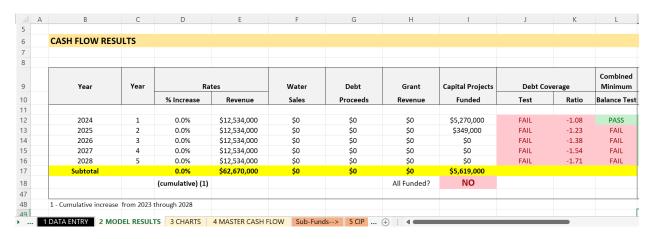

Financial Planning

The fundamental objective for this rate study is to provide compliance with legal requirements while ensuring that the City's wastewater utility is self-sufficient. Our study will include a comprehensive review of the wastewater utility's finances, including operating costs, reserve funds, and deferred maintenance and capital funding needs to ensure that rates cover the full cost of providing service. We are proponents of simplicity and respecting the current financial and political climate while phasing-in rate adjustments.

L&T will provide cash flow analyses in an Excel-based model fed by a financial dashboard showing how each variable impacts the City's bottom line. L&T will work closely with the City to determine which financial parameters are most important (meeting debt coverage, rate impacts, accumulating reserves, funding capital projects, etc.) and incorporate them into our alternatives. We find that when the ratepayers understand the need for the fees and the basis of costs they are more accepting of increases. Outreach is particularly important for smaller public agencies as they have a greater risk of ratepayers garnering a 50% majority protest to deny a rate adjustment. L&T understands that the rate study process can be burdensome for public agencies. Our goal is to take on as many administrative tasks as possible to streamline the study. L&T will be responsible for all project analysis and the preparation of meeting and presentation materials for project team and Council meetings. L&T will also draft the final study report as well as the Proposition 218 mailer and additional public outreach materials as requested by the City. Expected time commitment and information required from City staff can be estimated based on the following tasks:

- Respond to L&T's data request consisting of items such as: budgets, audits, utility billing data, capital improvement plans, and master plans
- Attend kickoff and progress meetings (agenda and materials will be provided in advance)
- Review and comment upon draft and final reports
- Coordinate and schedule meetings with City Council

4. SCOPE OF WORK

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Provided below is our suggested scope of services which elaborates on our project approach and methodology. L&T will work with the City to finalize a scope tailored to meet your needs.



Task I - Project Kickoff and Data Gathering

Kickoff Meeting

L&T will meet with City staff for a project kickoff meeting to review study goals, milestones, identify project team members, and determine roles and responsibilities.

Data Gathering

Assemble the necessary data to complete the study. The goal is to understand the City's financial standing, current rate structure, and utility billing information. A data needs list will be provided to the City prior to the kickoff meeting.

Task 2 – Wastewater Financial Plan

Annual Revenue Requirements

With staff input, we will estimate future operating and capital expenditures to estimate annual revenue needs. We will factor in projections of growth, repairs and replacements, cost escalation, sewer flows,

regulatory compliance, and operational changes to ensure that all future expenses are included. L&T will work with the City to determine appropriate inflationary increases.

Review Reserve Fund Targets

This subtask involves reviewing the current operating and capital reserve balances for each utility and evaluating reserve targets for emergency reserves, rate stability reserves, long term capital reserves, short term capital reserves, or other categories as appropriate. At minimum, our analysis will review the age and condition of the systems, annual depreciation costs, debt service reserves, and expenses related to emergencies.

Evaluate Debt Service Coverage

L&T will review budgets, audits, and bond disclosure documents to understand current debt obligations. We will determine current coverage ratios based on net operating revenues compared to annual debt service expenses. We can also evaluate if the utilities have capacity to take on additional debt at the current revenues. Our final rate recommendations will include projections for the City to meet its coverage requirements in the years to come.

Review Capital Improvement Needs

Our cash flow analysis will isolate the impacts of capital funding separate from increases needed to fund other utility expenses. Typically, L&T suggests three capital funding scenarios: I) bare bones: fund only critical improvements, 2) priority funding: fund critical projects plus high-priority, level of service improvements, and 3) full funding: fund all proposed projects. We will work with the City to determine project affordability and adjust our rate recommendations accordingly. L&T will review various financing options to fund capital needs, including pay-as-you-go/cash funding and other debt financing alternatives, such as State loans/grants, bank loans, and certificates of participation/bonds.

Cash Flow Projections

Annual revenue requirements and capital funding needs will be used to develop long-term wastewater cash flow projections summarizing the financial position of the utilities over the next 10 years. The cash flow projections will estimate rate increases needed to meet annual revenue requirements, debt obligations, and reserve fund targets. Based on input from the project team, L&T will incorporate rate sensitivity analysis to determine affordability.

Task 3 - Cost Allocation

Evaluate Customer Billing Data

We will evaluate current billing and consumption data to estimate sewer flow. For residential customers, we will estimate a standard flow using average winter water use. This will serve as the basis for the residential rates. We will also update the pollutant loadings and strength characteristics of each customer class to determine whether modifications are warranted.

Functionalize Costs

Functionalization is the allocation of expenses by major operating activities for the utility, including water supply, peak pumping, treatment, storage, transmission, overhead, and administration. Sewer categories will consist of customer service, flow, BOD, and TSS.

Allocation to Customer Classes

After costs have been categorized by function, costs are then allocated to each customer class based on water demand and sewer flow and loading characteristics. The result produces revenue requirements for each customer class which can be recovered via fixed charges and usage rates. The allocation to customer classes will be based industry best practices and meet the proportionality requirements of Proposition 218.

Task 4 – Rate Design

Assess Rate Structure and Customer Classifications

Review the City's current rate structures and customer classifications to assess the advantages and disadvantages of the existing systems and to determine compliance with industry standards and court rulings. While compliance with Proposition 218 will guide all our recommendations, additional criteria may include: ease of understanding, revenue stability, the impact on customer bills, public implementation, compatibility with the existing billing system, and staff effort needed for administration.

Survey of Local Rates

We will prepare a survey comparing the City's current and proposed residential sewer bills to regional agencies. The survey will be summarized in tables and charts that can be used for outreach, presentations, and the final report. We will also prepare bill comparisons for different customer classes if requested. The final list of surveyed agencies will be determined by the City.

Calculate Bill Impacts

Based on the recommended rates, calculate the bill impacts for a sample of typical customers including both residential and non-residential.

Finalize Recommendations

Our rate recommendations will include multi-year rate increases and possible rate structure modifications based on input from staff. We will calculate the impacts to ratepayers, and if needed, develop an implementation plan to phase-in adjustments to ease the impact on customers.

Task 5 – Draft and Final Reports

Submit a draft summary report for City review and feedback. The report will summarize findings and recommendations and discuss key alternatives when applicable. The final report will reflect input received. Our reports are intended to serve as the administrative record for the City and will be compliant with Propositions 218 and 26. All study materials will be submitted to the City in their native format (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, etc.).

Task 6 - Meetings & Presentations

To begin the study, we will hold an in-person kickoff meeting with the City. We will conduct our analysis and hold a virtual meeting with staff to review initial recommendations. The next step is to provide a presentation of our draft findings to City Council, revise our materials as needed, and provide a presentation of our final recommendations. Our final meeting will be attendance at the Proposition 218 public hearing for rate adoption. In total, our proposal includes four in-person meetings in addition to virtual progress meetings with staff.

Task 7 – Proposition 218 Assistance

L&T is available to provide comprehensive Proposition 218 procedural assistance including printing and mailing of notices. We recommend that the City use the Proposition 218 notice as an outreach opportunity to explain the legal requirements behind why the rate adjustments are needed and to highlight what the City has done to help reduce costs.

L&T will coordinate and conduct all deliverables associated with compliance with Proposition 218 including: developing and validating the affected property owner mailing list with the City's billed customers, drafting the Proposition 218 notice, translating the notice into Spanish or other languages if needed, printing the notices, and certifying the mailing of the notices. We will coordinate with our printing service to print and mail the notices more than 45 days in advance of the hearing. At the public hearing, we will certify the protest tally to City Council.

CITY OF KERMAN

Water and Sewer Rate Study

Kerman is a city of about 14,000 people located in Fresno County about 15 miles west of the City of Fresno. October 2018, L&T completed a Water and Sewer Rate Study for the City and is currently engaged to conduct an update. Alison Lechowicz served as lead analyst and project manager.



The rate study corresponded with the City's water metering project. A key element was to project water use for newly metered customers (about half the service area). We compared the characteristics of the fully metered and newly metered customers to conservatively estimate water consumption. As part of the study, Ms. Lechowicz advocated for ongoing pipeline replacement funding. Prior to this effort, City policy was to forego main replacements to keep rates as low as possible. L&T was successful in raising the rates to reinvest in infrastructure to avoid costly future repairs.

The City's prior rate study assigned significantly lower cost to multifamily customers compared to single family customers. Staff was concerned that multifamily customers were not paying their fair share of customer service and maintenance expenses. L&T conducted a cost allocation and flow analysis to justify a rate adjustment for multifamily customers.

Ms. Lechowicz assisted the City with Proposition 218 implementation. Activities included drafting the public notice, reviewing edits with the City Attorney, answering procedural questions, attending the public hearing, and certifying the protest vote tabulation.

In July 2023, the City selected L&T to update the water, sewer and storm rates. The study is currently underway with a Proposition 218 hearing tentatively scheduled for December.

CITY OF CHOWCHILLA

Water, Sewer, Solid Waste and Storm Rate Study

June 2020, L&T finalized a comprehensive utilities rate study for the City of Chowchilla's water, sewer, solid waste, and storm water enterprises. Alison Lechowicz served as co-financial analyst and Catherine Tseng served as co-financial analyst and project manager. Located in Madera County, the City operates and maintains the water, sewer, and storm



water utilities. The last water and sewer rate study was conducted in 2012 in which the City adopted water and sewer rates through 2021. However, rates for the solid waste and storm drain utilities had not been increased in over 10 years.

L&T developed three rate options based on varying levels of capital funding for water, sewer, and storm water. The rate options for solid waste were based on repayment of an interfund loan to the General Fund. Since the last water and sewer rate study, the City had completed metering all customers, and the non-metered rates had been phased out. Because the City was only in the second year of being fully metered, historical consumption data was limited. The study included updated cost of service analysis and recommended rate adjustments through FY2024/25. L&T also managed the drafting, printing, and mailing of the Proposition 218 notice.

Mid Valley Disposal is the City's solid waste hauler and sets base rates for service. L&T analyzed additional costs of service including City administration, overhead cost allocation, capital outlay cost allocation, recommended replenishment of reserves, and repayment of operating deficits. We offered three planning scenarios based on repayment options of the interfund loan (used to cover deficits). The study included updated cost of service analysis and recommended rate adjustments through FY2024/25.

The City Council approved rate increases for the water, sewer, and solid waste utilities but will reconsider the storm drain rates in the future once the procedure for adopting storm drain rates has been successfully implemented by other agencies in the State.

CITY OF GONZALES

Water and Sewer Rate Study

The City of Gonzales is located on Highway 101 in Monterey County and serves a population of about 8,700 residents. September 2023, L&T submitted a final Water and Sewer Rate Study Report to the City and the Proposition 218 public hearing is scheduled for November 20. Alison Lechowicz served as project manager for the study.



The City's existing wastewater treatment plant is at capacity and the City is facing capital funding needs of \$30 million to construct a new industrial treatment plant and make improvements to its domestic treatment stream. L&T worked extensively with City staff, outside engineers, and State Revolving Fund loan officers to determine a financial plan and rate schedule that will meet the City's needs.

Decades had passed since the City conducted a comprehensive rate study and the City had implemented inflationary increases to keep up with costs. These increases are not sufficient to fund upcoming debt service costs for the new treatment plant. L&T provided options to the City for increasing the cost of service as well as adjusting its rate structure. We reviewed winter water use statistics to determine typical residential sewer flows and analyzed the metered effluent records of

Ms. Lechowicz provided two presentations to City Council to summarize our rate recommendations. Ms. Sophia Mills provided Spanish translations of our materials. Proposition 218 outreach was included in our scope of services. We drafted the notice of public hearing, coordinated with the City Attorney for legal review, and conducted the printing and mailing.





AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (Between the City of Waterford and LECHOWICZ + TSENG MUNICIPAL CONSULTANTS)

THIS AGREEMENT made this 19th day of October, 2023 between LECHOWICZ + TSENG MUNICIPAL CONSULTANTS, having a principal place of business at ALAMEDA, CA, hereinafter referred to as the "Consultant", and The City of Waterford, hereinafter referred to as the "City", 101 "E" Street, P.O. Box 199, Waterford, CA 95386.

Legal Status of CITY

The City is a General Law City, a municipal corporation formed under the laws of the State of California.

Legal Status

The Consultant is a Corporation operating under the laws of the State of California and is in the business of municipal consulting services.

Business of CITY

The City performs municipal functions through its City and related entities.

Independent Contractor

In the performance of the work, duties and obligations devolving upon Consultant under this agreement, it is mutually agreed and understood that Consultant is an independent contractor, and the sole interest and responsibility of City is to assure that the services covered by this agreement shall be performed and rendered in a competent, efficient and satisfactory manner.

Work Schedule

Consultant will exercise its best efforts to complete tasks on the schedule agreed upon between Consultant and City's representative, the City Manager.

Term of Agreement

This agreement shall become effective as of the date hereinabove stated and shall continue in effect as noted in the attachment. The City shall have the right to extend the term of this Contract.

Compensated Services to Be Performed by Consultant

Consultant agrees to perform the services set forth in the proposal attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. Work products as a result of this scope shall become the property of the City, and made available to the City at its request within a reasonable time of being requested.

Payment for all services performed by the Consultant shall be as set forth and shall be considered as full compensation for all personnel, consultants, materials, supplies, services and equipment used in carrying out the work described by this Contract.

Insurance

1. Category 1 "Low Risk"

Insurance Requirements

- i. Commercial General Liability
 - a. Vendor shall maintain commercial general liability insurance with coverage at least as broad as Insurance Services Office form CG 00 01, in an amount not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage, including without limitation, blanket contractual liability. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit. Vendor's general liability policies shall be primary and shall not seek contribution from the City's coverage, and be endorsed using Insurance Services Office form CG 20 10 (or equivalent) to provide that City and its officers, officials, employees, and agents shall be additional insureds under such policies. For construction projects, an endorsement providing completed operations coverage for the additional insured, ISO form CG 20 37 (or equivalent), is also required.
 - b. Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies by Vendor shall not affect coverage provided the City.
 - c. Coverage shall state that Vendor insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
 - d. Coverage shall contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of the City.
- ii. Business Automobile Liability
 - a. Vendor shall provide auto liability coverage for owned, non-owned, and hired autos using ISO Business Auto Coverage form CA 00 01 (or equivalent) with a limit of no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident.
- iii. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Statutory
 - a. Vendor shall maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance with limits of at least one million

dollars (\$1,000,000). Vendor shall submit to City, along with the certificate of insurance, a waiver of subrogation endorsement in favor of City, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers.

(Coverage can be waived by city, if vendor, in writing, confirms not required to carry coverage)

iv. Professional Liability Insurance

i. Contractor shall maintain professional liability insurance that insures against professional errors and omissions that may be made in performing the Services to be rendered in connection with this Agreement, in the minimum amount of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) per claim and in the aggregate. Any policy inception date, continuity date, or retroactive date must be before the effective date of this agreement, and Contractor agrees to maintain continuous coverage through a period no less than three years after completion of the services required by this agreement.

v. All Coverages

- i. Each insurance policy required by the agreement shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, cancelled, or reduced in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice has been given to the City, except that ten (10) days' prior written notice shall apply in the event of cancellation for nonpayment of premium.
- ii. All self-insurance, self-insured retentions, and deductibles must be declared and approved by the City.
- iii. Evidence of Insurance Prior to commencement of work, the Vendor shall furnish the City with certificates, additional insured endorsements, and waivers of subrogation evidencing compliance with the insurance requirements above. The Vendor must agree to provide complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies if requested by the City.
- iv. Acceptability of Insurers Insurance shall be placed with insurers admitted in the State of California and with an AM Best rating of A-VII or higher.

Indemnity

Indemnification. When the law establishes a professional standard of

care for Consultant's Services, to the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, protect, defend, and hold harmless City and any and all of its officials, employees and agents from and against any and all losses, liabilities, damages, costs, and expenses, including legal counsel's fees and costs but only to the extent the Consultant (and its Subconsultants), are responsible for such damages, liabilities and costs on a comparative basis of fault between the Consultant (and its Subconsultants) and the City in the performance of professional services under this agreement.

Other than in the performance of professional services and to the full extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless City, and any and all of its employees, officials and agents from and against any liability (including liability for claims, suits, actions, arbitration proceedings, administrative proceedings, regulatory proceedings, losses, expenses or costs of any kind, whether actual, alleged or threatened, including legal counsel's fees and costs, court costs, interest, defense costs, and expert witness fees), where the same arise out of, are a consequence of, or are in any way attributable to, in whole or in part, the performance of this Agreement by Consultant or by any individual or City for which Consultant is legally liable, including, but not limited to officers, agents, employees, or subcontractors of Consultant.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein shall be construed to require Consultant to indemnify the Indemnified Parties from any Claim arising from the active negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnified Parties. Nothing in this indemnity shall be construed as authorizing any award of attorney's fees in any action on or to enforce the terms of this Agreement. This indemnity shall apply to all claims and liability regardless of whether any insurance policies are applicable. The policy limits do not act as a limitation upon the amount of indemnification to be provided by the Consultant.

In the event the City indemnitees are made a party to any action, lawsuit, or other adversarial proceeding arising from Consultant's performance of this agreement, the Consultant shall provide a defense to the City indemnitees, or at the City's option, reimburse the City indemnitees their costs of defense, including reasonable legal counsels' fees, incurred in defense of such claims.

Compliance

The Consultant shall keep itself fully informed of and shall observe and comply with and shall cause any and all persons, firms or corporations employed by it or under its control to observe and comply with all federal, state, county and municipal laws, ordinances, regulations, orders, and decrees which in any manner affect those engaged or employed on the work described by this Contract or the materials used or which in any way affect the conduct of the work.

Billing

The Consultant shall maintain and make available for inspection by the City and its auditors accurate records of all of its costs, disbursements and receipts with respect to any work under this Contract. Such inspections may be made during regular office hours at any time until **six (6)**

months after the final payments under this Contract are made to the Consultant.

Termination Upon Notice

This Agreement may be terminated by the City by giving the Consultant **thirty (30) days** written notice to the other party.

Termination for Unsatisfactory Performance

Should the City at any time become dissatisfied with the Consultant's performance under this Agreement, City may terminate this Agreement immediately upon giving notice in writing to the Consultant. The City shall be the sole judge as to whether the performance of the Consultant is satisfactory.

Time is of the Essence

Time is of the essence of this Agreement.

Arbitration

Any dispute arising under this Agreement shall be settled by arbitration in accordance with the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association, and judgment on the award rendered by the Arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction.

Notices

Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other, may be affected either by personal delivery in writing or by mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid with return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the addresses of the parties as they appear in the introductory paragraph of this agreement, but each party may change address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally shall be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices shall be deemed communicated as of **five (5) days** after mailing.

Entire Contract

This instrument contains the entire agreement between the parties relating to the rights herein granted and the obligations herein assumed. Any oral representations or modifications concerning this instrument shall be of no force or effect excepting a subsequent modification in writing, signed by the party to be charged.

Partial Invalidity

Partial invalidity of this agreement shall not affect the remainder.

Governing Law

SUMMARY:

The City Council is being asked to award bid and approving an agreement with United Pavement Maintenance, Inc. in the amount of \$631,457.28 for Project No. 2023-08 "Western Ave, Pecan Ave, and Dorsey St. Improvements" and authorizing the City Manager to execute the agreement.

ANALYSIS:

This project will be located at N. Western Ave. from Washburn Ave. to F Street, Pecan Avenue from N. Western Ave. to Church Street and Dorsey Street from Church Street to F Street. This project will consist of the installation of frontage improvements, including curb, gutter, and sidewalk, pavement widening, curb return upgrades, storm drain improvements, water and sewer improvements, pavement resurfacing, and striping. All proposed improvements are within the City's right-of-way.

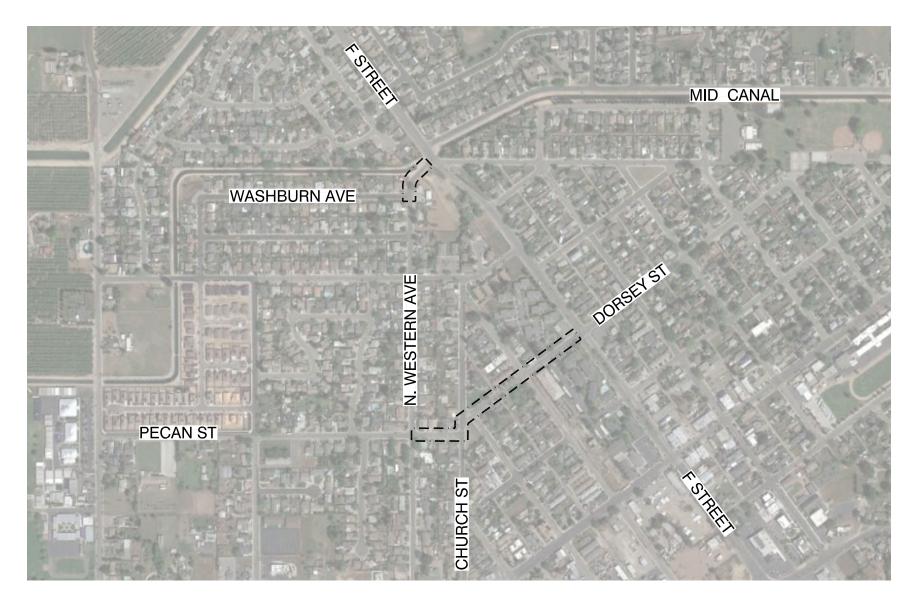

AGREEMENT

FOR

PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT NO. 2023-08

"WESTERN AVE, PECAN AVE, AND DORSEY ST. IMPROVEMENTS"

THIS AGREEMENT, is entered between the CITY OF WATERFORD, a Municipal Corporation, herein called "City", and Taylor Backhoe Service, Inc. herein called "Contractor", on **October 5**, 2023.

RECITALS

- (a) City has taken appropriate proceedings to authorize construction of the public work and improvements herein provided, and execution of this Agreement.
- (b) A notice was duly published for bids for the contract for the improvement hereinafter described.
- (c) On October 5, 2023, after notice duly given, the City Council of said City awarded the contract for the construction of the improvements hereinafter described to Contractor, which Contractor said Council found to be the lowest responsible bidder for said improvements.
- (d) City and Contractor desire to enter into this Agreement for the construction of said improvements.

IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Scope of Work:

Contractor shall perform the work described briefly as follows:

All work as specified on the Plans and in the Special Provisions, dated <u>June</u>, <u>2023</u> for the project, <u>Western Ave</u>, <u>Pecan</u>, <u>Ave and Dorsey St.</u> <u>Improvements</u>.

The aforesaid improvements are further described in the plans, specifications and technical requirements for such project, copies of which are on file in the office of the City Engineer, previously provided to Contractor, and which are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth fully herein.

2. The Contract:

The complete contract consists of the following documents: This Agreement, the notice to contractors, the Contractor's accepted proposal, general conditions, special provisions, plans and detailed drawings, faithful performance bond and labor and materials bond and any and all supplemental agreements amending, decreasing, or extending the work contemplated or which may be required to complete the work in a satisfactory and acceptable manner. The Current Edition of the "City of Waterford Standard Specifications and Drawings" is hereby incorporated as a part of the contract.

All rights and obligations of City and Contractor are set forth and described in the contract.

All of the above named documents are intended to cooperate so that any work called for in one and not mentioned in the other, or vice versa, is to be executed the same as if mentioned in all said documents. The documents comprising the complete contract will hereinafter be referred to as the "contract". In case of any dispute, the decision of the City Engineer shall be final.

3. Schedule:

All work shall be performed in accordance with the schedule provided by City Engineer, and under his direction.

4. Equipment & Performance of Work:

Contractor shall furnish all tools, equipment, facilities, labor and materials necessary to perform and complete in good workmanlike manner the work of general construction as called for and in the manner designated in and in strict conformity with the plans and specifications for said work, which said specifications are entitled, "General Conditions and Special Provisions for

"Western Ave, Pecan Ave, and Dorsey St. Improvements"

The equipment, apparatus, facilities, labor and material shall be furnished, and said work performed and completed as required in said plans and specifications under the direction and supervision, and subject to the approval, of the City Engineer of said City, or his designated agent.

5. <u>Contract Price</u>:

City shall pay, and Contractor shall accept in full payment for the work above

agreed to be done, the sum of: <u>Six Hundred and Thirty-One Thousand, Four Hundred and Fifty-Seven dollars and Twenty-Eight Cents</u> (\$631,457.28). Said price is determined by the unit prices contained in Contractor's bid. In the event work is performed or materials furnished in addition to those set forth in Contractor's bid and the specifications herein, said work and materials will be paid for at the unit price therein contained. Said amount shall be paid in installments as hereinafter provided.

6. <u>Time for Performance</u>:

The time fixed for the commencement of such work is ten (10) calendar days after the "Notice to Proceed" has been issued. The work on this project shall be completed on or before forty five (45) calendar days after the date of the "Notice to Proceed".

7. Rights of City to Increase Working Days:

If such work is not completed within such time, the City Council shall have the right to increase the number of working days in the amount it may determine will best serve the interests of the City, and if it desires to increase said number of working days, it shall have the further right to charge the Contractor and deduct from the final payment for the work the actual cost of engineering, inspection, superintendence, and other overhead expenses which are directly chargeable to Contractor, and which accrue during the period of such extension except that the cost of the final service and preparation of the final estimates shall not be included in such charges; provided, however, that no extension of time for completion of such work shall ever be allowed unless requested by Contractor at least twenty (20) calendar days prior to the time herein fixed for the completion thereof, in writing, with the City Clerk, addressed to the City Council. In this connection, it is understood that the City Clerk shall not transmit any such request to the City Council if not filed within the time herein prescribed.

8. Option of City to Terminate Agreement in Event of Failure to Complete Work:

If Contractor shall have refused or failed to prosecute the work, or any severable part thereof, with such diligence as will insure its completion within the time specified or any extensions thereof, or shall have failed to complete said work within such time if Contractor should be adjudged a bankrupt, or if Contractor should make a general assignment for the benefit of Contractor's creditors, or if a receiver should be appointed in the event of Contractor's insolvency, or if Contractor or any subcontractor should violate any of the provisions of this Agreement, the City Engineer or the City Council may give written notice to Contractor and Contractor's

sureties of its intention to terminate this Agreement, and unless within five (5) days after the serving of such notice such violation shall cease and satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof made, this Agreement may, at the option of City, upon the expiration of said time, cease and terminate.

9. <u>Liquidated Damages</u>:

In the event Contractor for any reason shall have failed to perform the work herein specified within the time herein required and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer, City may, in lieu of any other of its rights authorized by paragraph 8 of this Agreement, deduct from payments or credits due Contractor after such breach, a sum equal to one thousand (\$1,000) Dollars as liquidated damages for each calendar day beyond the date herein provided for the completion of such work.

10. Performance by Sureties:

In the event of any termination as herein-before provided, City shall immediately give written notice thereof to Contractor and Contractor's sureties, and the sureties shall have the right to take over and perform the Agreement; provided, however, that if the sureties within five (5) days after giving them said notice of termination, do not give the City written notice of their intention to take over the performance of the Agreement and do not commence performance thereof within five (5) days after notice to the City of such election, City may take over the work and prosecute the same to completion by contract or by any other method it may deem advisable for the account, and at the expense of Contractor and the Sureties shall be liable to City for any excess cost or damages occasioned City thereby; and, in such event, City may, without liability for so doing, take possession of and utilize in completing the work such materials, appliances, plant and other property belonging to Contractor as may be on the site of the work and necessary therefore.

11. <u>Disputes Pertaining to Payment for Work:</u>

Should any dispute arise respecting the true value of any work done, of any work omitted, or of any extra work which Contractor may be required to do, or respecting the size of any payment to contractor during the performance of this contract, such dispute shall be decided by the City Engineer, and the decision of the latter shall be final and conclusive.

12. <u>Permits, Compliance with Law</u>:

Contractor shall, at Contractor's expense, obtain all necessary permits and licenses for the construction of each improvement, give all necessary notices and pay all fees and taxes required by law.

13. Superintendence by Contractor:

Contractor shall give personal superintendence to the work on said improvement or have a competent foreman or superintendent satisfactory to the City Engineer on the work at all times during progress, with authority to act for him.

14. <u>Inspection by City</u>:

Contractor shall at all times maintain proper facilities and provide safe access for inspection by City to all parts of the work and to the shops wherein the work is in preparation.

15. Extra and/or Additional Work and Changes:

Should City at any time during the progress of said work request any alterations, deviations, additions, or omissions from said specifications or plans or other contract documents, it shall be at liberty to do so, and the same shall in no way affect or make void the contract, but will be added to or deducted from the amount of said contract price as the case may be, by fair and reasonable valuation. Request for such change must be made in writing signed by the City Engineer, shall be accompanied by plans and specifications for such propose, shall be accepted in writing by Contractor and Contractor's surety.

16. <u>Inspection and Testing of Materials</u>:

Contractor shall notify City a sufficient time in advance of the manufacture of production materials to be supplied by Contractor under this contract in order that City may arrange for mill or factory inspection and testing of same, as required by the City.

Any materials shipped by Contractor from factory prior to having satisfactorily passed such testing and inspection by City's representative or prior to the receipt of notice from such representative that such testing and inspection will not be required shall not be incorporated on the job of said improvement.

Contractor shall also furnish City, in triplicate, certified copies of all factory and mill test reports upon request.

17. Permits and Care of the Work:

Contractor has examined the site of the work and is familiar with its topography and condition, location of property lines, easements, building lines, and other physical factors and limitations affecting the performance of this Agreement. Contractor, at Contractor's expense, shall obtain any permission necessary for any operations

conducted off the property owned or controlled by City. Contractor shall be responsible for the proper care and protection of all materials delivered and work performed until completion and final acceptance.

18. Other Contracts:

City may award other contracts for additional work, and Contractor shall fully cooperate with such other Contractors and carefully fit Contractor's own work to that provided under other contracts as may be directed by the City Engineer. Contractor shall not commit or permit any act which will interfere with the performance of work by any other Contractor.

19. Payments to Contractor:

Payments are to be made to the Contractor in accordance with the provisions of Section <u>9</u> of the General Conditions of said specifications in legally executed and regularly issued warrants of the City, drawn on the appropriate fund or funds as required by law and order of the City Council thereof.

20. <u>Contract Security</u>:

Concurrently with the execution hereof, Contractor shall furnish on the forms provided (1) a surety bond in an amount equal to at least one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price as security for the faithful performance of this contract; and (2) a separate surety bond in an amount equal to at least one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price as security for the payment of all persons performing labor and furnishing materials in connection with this contract. Sureties on each of said bonds thereof shall be satisfactory to the City Manager.

21. Indemnity:

Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless City, its officers, employees, agents and volunteers from and against all liability, loss, damage, expense, and cost (including, without limitation, reasonable legal counsel fees, expert fees and all other costs and fees of litigation) of every nature arising out of or in connection with Contractor's negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct in the performance of work hereunder, or its failure to comply with any of its obligations contained in this Agreement, except such loss or damage caused by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the City. It is expressly understood and agreed that the foregoing provisions are intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the law of the State of California and will survive termination of this Agreement.

22. Contractor's Insurance:

(a) Minimum Limits of Insurance

(1) General Liability

Contractor shall maintain commercial general liability insurance with coverage at least as broad as Insurance Services Office form CG 00 01, in an amount not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage, including without limitation, blanket contractual liability and coverage for explosion, collapse and underground property damage hazards. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit. A combination of a general liability policy and excess liability policies may be utilized to achieve these limits. Contractor's general liability policies shall be primary and shall not seek contribution from the City's coverage, and be endorsed using Insurance Services Office form CG 20 10 to provide that City and its officers, officials, employees, and agents shall be additional insureds under such policies. An endorsement providing completed operations to the additional insured, ISO form CG 20 37, is also required.

(2) Auto Liability

Contractor shall provide auto liability coverage for owned, non-owned, and hired autos using ISO Business Auto Coverage form CA 00 01, or the exact equivalent, with a limit of no less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) per accident.

(3) Workers' Compensation

Contractor shall maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance (Statutory Limits) and Employer's Liability Insurance with limits of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000). Contractor shall submit to City, along with the certificate of insurance, a Waiver of Subrogation endorsement in favor of City, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers.

(b) Deductibles and Self-Insured Retention:

Any deductible or self-insured retention must be declared to and approved by the City. At the option of the City, either: the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductible for self-insured retention as respects the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers; or the Contractor shall post a security (including but not limited to cash, letter of credit, etc.) guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses.

(c) Other Insurance Provisions

The policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

(1) General Liability and Automobile Liability Coverage

- (a) Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the City, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers.
- (b) The Contractor's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made for suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.

(2) <u>All Coverage</u>:

- (a) Each insurance policy required by this section shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, canceled by either party, reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the City.
- (b) The Contractor shall require the subcontractors, if any, to take out and maintain similar Commercial General Liability and Property Damage Insurance.
- (c) In case any of the work under this Contract is to be performed on, or at, the site of the project by the subcontractor, the contractor shall take out and maintain such contractor's Contingent or Protective Insurance as will protect him, the Owner, and the Engineer from damage claims arising from the operations of any subcontractor.

(d) <u>Acceptability of Insurer</u>:

Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a Best's rating of no less than A:VII.

In the event the form of any policy or certificate, or the amount of the insurance or the companies writing same are not satisfactory to the City, the Contractor shall furnish other policies or certificates in form and amount, and with companies satisfactory to the City. The Contractor shall not cause any policies to be canceled or permit it to lapse, and all policies shall include a clause to the effect that the policy or certificate shall not be subject to

cancellation or to a reduction in the required limits of liability or amounts of insurance until notice has been mailed to the City stating when, not less than ten (10) days thereafter, such cancellation or reduction shall be effective. All certificates of insurance, authenticated by the proper officer of the insurer, shall state in particular those insured, the extent of the insurance, the location and operations to which the insurance applies, the expiration date, and the above-mentioned notice of cancellation clause.

The Contractor shall furnish to the City at the date of delivering the signed contracts and bonds, certificates or riders duly executed on behalf of the surety company, certifying as to the amounts of insurance carried, and providing for the coverage therein of the City, its officers, agents, and employees, within all risks arising out of the project.

23. **Proof of Carriage of Insurance**:

Contractor shall furnish City on City Forms, through the City Engineer, concurrently with the execution hereof, with satisfactory proof of carriage of the insurance required, and that each carrier shall give City at least thirty (30) days prior notice of the cancellation of any policy during the effective period of this contract.

24. Wages & Hours of Employment:

In the performance of this contract, eight (8) hours shall be the maximum hours of labor on any calendar day, and the minimum wages of compensation of persons performing labor in the execution of this Agreement shall be the current prevailing scale of wages determined by the U.S. Secretary of Labor for the community and on file with the City Engineer.

The Contractor shall forfeit as penalty to the City, Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25) to be paid to the City of Waterford for each workman employed in the execution of this Agreement by him or by any subcontractor, for each calendar day during which any workman is required or permitted to labor more than eight (8) hours, in violation of provisions of Article 3, Chapter 1, Part 7, a Division 2, of the Labor Code of the State of California, and all amendments thereto.

25. <u>Emergency - Additional Time for Performance - Procurement of Materials:</u>

If, because of war or other declared national emergency, the Federal or State Government restricts, regulates, or controls the procurement and allocation of labor or materials, or both, and if solely because of said restrictions, regulations or controls, contractor is through no fault of the contractor, unable to perform this Agreement, or the work is thereby suspended or delayed, any of the following steps may be taken.

(a) City may, pursuant to resolution of the Council, grant Contractor additional time for the performance of this Agreement, sufficient to compensate in time, for delay or suspension.

To qualify for such extension in time, Contractor within ten (10) days of Contractor's discovering such inability to perform, shall notify City Engineer in writing thereof, and give specific reasons therefore; City Engineer shall thereupon have sixty (60) days within which to procure such needed materials or labor as is specified in this Agreement, or permit substitution, or provide for changes in the work in accordance with other provisions of this Agreement. Substituted materials, or changes in the work, or both, shall be ordered in writing by City Engineer, and the concurrence of the Council shall not be necessary. All reasonable expenses of such procurement incurred by the City Engineer shall be defrayed by the Contractor; or

- (b) If such materials or labor cannot be procured through legitimate channels within sixty (60) days after the filing of the aforesaid notice, either party may, upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other, terminate this Agreement. In such event, Contractor shall be compensated for all work executed upon a unit basis in proportion to the amount of the work completed, or upon a cost-plus ten percent (10%) basis, whichever is the lesser. Materials on the ground, in process of fabrication or in route upon the date of notice of termination specially ordered for the project and which cannot be utilized by Contractor, shall be compensated for by City at cost, including freight, provided the Contractor shall take all steps possible to minimize this obligation; or
- (c) City Council, by resolution, may suspend this Agreement until the cause of inability to perform is removed but for a period of not to exceed sixty (60) days.
 - If this Agreement is not canceled, and the inability of Contractor to perform continues without fault on Contractor's part, beyond the time during which the Agreement may have been suspended, as hereinabove provided, City Council may further suspend this Agreement, or either party hereto may, without incurring any liability, elect to declare this Agreement terminated upon the ground of impossibility of performance. In the event City declares this Agreement terminated, such declaration shall be authorized by the City Council by resolution, and Contractor shall be notified in writing thereof within five (5) days after the adoption of such resolution. Upon such termination, Contractor shall be entitled to proportionate compensation at the Agreement rate for such portion of the Agreement as may have been performed, or
- (d) City may terminate this Agreement, in which case Contractor shall be entitled to proportionate compensation at the agreed rate for such portion of the Agreement as may have been performed. Such termination shall be authorized by resolution of the Council. Notice thereof shall be forthwith given in writing to Contractor, and this Agreement shall be terminated upon receipt by Contractor of such notice. In the event of the termination provided in this sub-paragraph (d), none of the covenants, conditions or provisions hereof shall apply to the work not performed, and City shall be liable to Contractor for the proportionate compensation last herein mentioned.

26. <u>Provisions Cumulative</u>:

The provisions of this Agreement are cumulative, and in addition to and not in limitation of, any other rights or remedies available to City.

27. Notices:

All notices shall be in writing and delivered in person or transmitted by certified mail, postage prepaid.

Motion: Reaffirming the Declaration of Emergency made by the City Manager on

September 20, 2023 and Declaring there is a Need to Continue with Project No.

2023-14, "Emergency Repair of River Pointe Well 1."

SUMMARY:

City Council is being asked to reaffirm the declaration of emergency made by the City Manager on September 20, 2023 and declaring there is a need to continue with Project No. 2023-14, "Emergency Repair of River Pointe Well 1."

ANALYSIS:

On September 20, 2023, Howk was called out due to the pump at Well 1 was locked up, they tried to turn the shaft of the pump to break it lose but it wouldn't budge. Upon taking the discharge piping apart they discovered the pipe 40% full of gravel. This is the first indication of a hole in the casing. They continued to pull the pump and it showed wear on the shaft with gravel imbedded in the bearings. After pulling the pump which was set at 260' Howk ran a line down the well for a depth measurement and the bottom was at 260' as well. Currently there is a hole letting the gravel pack into the well.

On September 20, 2023, the City Manager deemed the damaged Well 1 an emergency and ordered repair to commence immediately without giving notice for bids to let contracts in accordance with Section 22050 of the Public Contract Code under the authority given to him through Council Resolution No. 2018-57 (Exhibit 1). The Emergency Declaration was due to the need to make repairs quickly as the complete failure of the well left River Pointe with only one well to help support the River Pointe and Waterford system. If staff were to bid the repairs out it would take approximately 2-3 months to develop plans and specs, advertise for bids, open bids and take a contract to council for award. Given that we had no definitive understanding of the needed repairs, we would have likely had to do two projects, one to diagnose the problem and a second to make the repairs leaving the well offline for more than 6 months. Therefore, the City Manager, in an effort to expedite repairs, declared an emergency and orders work to commence to diagnose and make repairs immediately. Staff will continue to update the Council at every Council meeting reaffirming the emergency exists until the emergency ceases.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Each emergency action is different and the cost will be determined following the correction of the emergency situation. However, Howk has provided an initial estimate of \$30,261.80. Funding for these improvements will come from FY 23/24 Budget Line 5070-800-7420.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW:

This project is categorically exempted according to Title 14, Chapter 3, Article 19 of the Guidelines for Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), in accordance with Section 15301 "Existing Facilities."

ALTERNATIVES:

Reject the affirmation of the declaration of emergency declared by the City Manager. Staff does
not recommend this alternative as the City Council has delegated authority to the City Manager
to declare emergencies in accordance with Section 22050 of the Public Contract Code and
Council Resolution No. 2018-57 and the project is needed to maintain a viable water system
during the hot summer/fall months.

WHEREAS, there are times when sudden, unexpected occurrences pose a clear and imminent danger requiring immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss or impairment of life, health, property or essential public services (hereinafter "emergency"); and

WHEREAS, Section 22050(a)(1) of the Public Contract Code provides in the case of an emergency, a public agency pursuant to a 4/5ths vote of its governing body, may repair or replace a public facility, take any directly related and immediate action required by that emergency, and procure the necessary equipment, services, and supplies for those purposes, without giving notice for bids to let contracts; and

WHEREAS, Section 22050(b)(1) of the Public Contract Code provides that the governing body by a 4/5ths vote may delegate by resolution to the City Manager the authority to order any action pursuant to 22050(a)(1).

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WATERFORD, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Council of the City of Turlock does hereby, pursuant to section 22050(b)(1) of the Public Contract Code, delegate to the City Manager the authority to determine when an emergency exist and may repair or replace a public facility, take any directly related and immediate action required by the emergency, and procure the necessary equipment, services, and supplies for those purposes, without giving notice for bids to let contracts, pursuant to Public Contract Code section 22050(a)(1).
- 2. Pursuant to section 22050(b)(3) of the Public Contract Code, if the City Manager orders any action specified in the preceding paragraph, s/he shall report to the City Council at its next meeting the reasons justifying why the emergency will not permit a delay resulting from a competitive solicitation for bids and why the action is necessary to respond to the emergency.
- 3. The City Council shall initially review the emergency action not later than seven days after the action, or at its next regularly scheduled meeting if that meeting will occur not later than 14 days after the action, and at least at every regularly scheduled meeting thereafter until the action is terminated, to determine, by

4/5ths vote, that there is a need to continue the action, unless the City Manager has terminated that action prior to the City Council reviewing the emergency action and making a determination
